

Aggie notes

Track team on the run

The Texas Aggies leave Friday afternoon for Dallas where they'll compete in the Dallas Invitational Track and Field Meet Saturday.

Whereas last Saturday they finished fifth in the City of Palms Invitational in McAllen without Curtis Dickey, the Aggies this week should be at full strength. Dickey elected to pass the McAllen meet in order to attend the Texas A&M football banquet. Consequently, the Aggies did not enter the 400-meter relay and had no top entry in the 100-meter dash.

This will be Dickey's first running of the 100-meters this season. He raced outdoors once earlier won the 100-yard dash in the Border Olympics. His last action came in the ICAA Indoors Championships in Detroit, where he won the 60-yard dash title for the second straight year. He was clocked at 6.15.

Golf

Coach Bob Ellis and his Texas A&M men's golf team will concentrate on practice this week in preparation for next week's All-America Intercollegiate tournament in Houston. That meet runs April 4-7.

Last week in the Morris Williams Invitational in Austin, the Aggies hit jump and finished in a tie for 13th place. Their team total of 923, was 40 strokes off Oklahoma State's winning score of 887. Texas A&M's low scorer was Brad Jones with a 226. Then came Richard Cromwell at 230, Steve Bowman at 233, Doug Ward at 234 and Dave Ogrin at 239.

Tennis

Texas A&M's women's tennis team will travel to Austin this weekend for the annual University of Texas Invitational. The Aggie ladies are 8-4 for the spring after defeating Rice University 6-3 last week in College Station. The Aggie men's team will host No. 9 ranked Texas Longhorns Saturday at 1:30 p.m.

Softball

Texas A&M University announced the signing of Lori Stoll to a national letter of intent. Stoll, from Chillicothe, Mo., is considered to be on of the Midwest's top softball pitchers. She was highly recruited by numerous schools.

Stoll is a hard-throwing left hander who compiled a 17-7 record last summer playing for the North Missouri squad. Included in that record were 139 strike outs against some of the nation's finest teams.

According to Texas A&M coach Bill Galloway, Stoll is the type of player the Aggies are seeking to build up their softball program.

"We are looking for those players who have played against top caliber competition," Galloway said.

Aggie Club

Harry J. Green Jr., director of fund raising and development for the Aggie Club for the past four years, has been named executive vice-president of the athletic fundraising organization to succeed Don Brister who announced his resignation on March 19.

Green's promotion was made by the executive committee of the Aggie Club last Saturday and was announced by club president William Lewie Jr. of Waco.

Green, a 1952 graduate of Texas A&M, is a native of Houston. From 1969-74 he served as field director of Texas A&M's Association of Former Students and then spent a year in the hotel business in College Station prior to joining the Aggie Club staff.

Lacrosse

The Texas A&M lacrosse team had a successful weekend defeating SMU 10-9 on Saturday and defeating Texas 12-11 on Sunday.

The win Sunday came in double-overtime and boosted the Aggie's conference record to 5-0.

The Aggies host the Houston Cougars April 7 on the Drill Field. The team will travel to the Fiesta

Tournament on April 21-22 to face Texas Tech in a showdown for the league title.

Rodeo

In last weekend's Temple Junior College rodeo, Texas A&M's Beverly Acton finished first in breakaway roping and Wayne Bacon placed fourth in the calf roping event.

The Aggies will participate in the Stephen F. Austin rodeo in Nacogdoches April 13-14.

Polo

Texas A&M's polo team was defeated 26-6 by the University of California at Davis in the first round of the National Intercollegiate Polo Championships in Somers, Conn., Tuesday night.

The UC-Davis riders, defending champions, advanced to the semifinals against Cornell tonight, while the Aggies are out of the competition the single elimination tournament.

Going into last night's match, the Texas A&M team had defeated Yale 11-9 and the Norwich Military Academy 13-9 in practice rounds but were unable to move or score effectively against the heavily favored UC-Davis team.

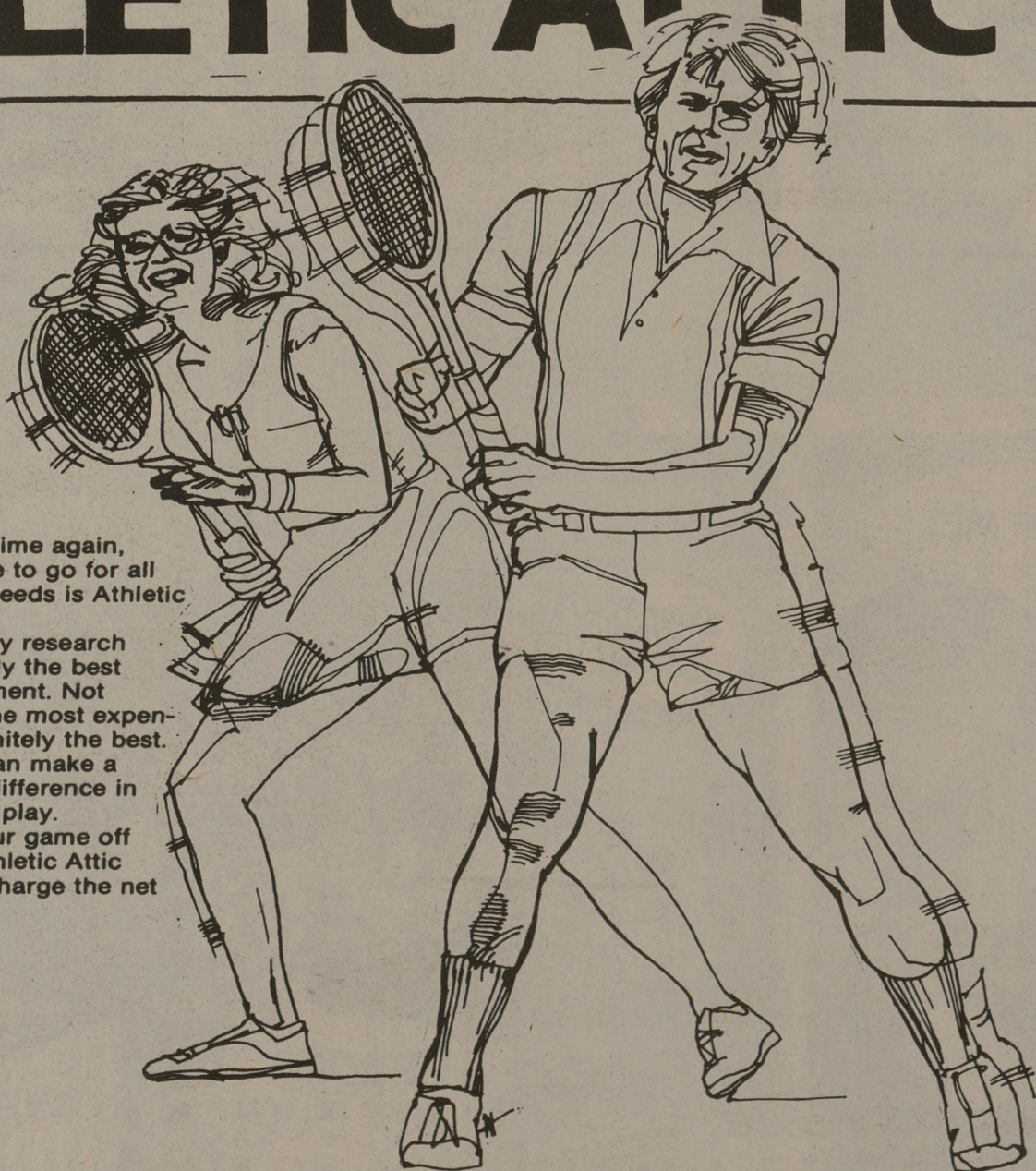
