


the present board's handling of the Hopson termination?In a school district, formal control of educational policy rests with the school board. The board appoints the superintendent. If the superintendent fails to effectively administer established policies, the board may terminate the superintendent's contract. While open communication between the board and the community has regrettably suffered with regard to Mr. Hopson's termination, I recognize the board's authority to end his contract and to search for a new superintendent who would effectively administer established policies.

What are your pet projects, if any?
