**Employees new prison escape policy**

HOUSTON — Hostaged employees knew their prison bosses would take whatever force was necessary to prevent inmates from escaping during a 1974 insurrection, witness testified today in the capital murder retrial of Ignacio Cuevas. Defense lawyer, Will Gray, worked to impress upon jurors that Texas Department of Corrections policy increased the danger to hostages, librarians, teachers and inmates. Witness Linda Woodman, a former librarian who survived the 41-day siege at the Walls Unit in Huntsville, said she was told TDC policy in the event of escape attempts when she went to work. "I was told that in the event you were held hostage, TDC will not let the inmates go," she said. "Even if it means the life of the hostages?" Gray asked. "Yes," she replied. "And that was TDC policy?" Gray asked. "That's right," she said. Gray tried to show the leader of the uprising was Fred Gomez Carrasco, who died in the shoot-out along with inmate Rudolfo Dominguez and two hostages. Woodman admitted Cuevas was not in charge when the inmates took over the prison education building July 24, 1974, although he boasted to her that he was. Cuevas, 46, of Acapulco, Mexico, is accused of the shooting death of librarian Julia Standley. Prison officials say Cuevas survived because he fainted during the gun battle that ended the siege.

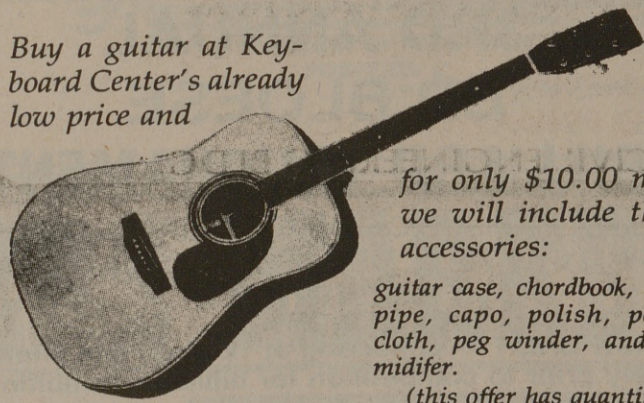
