Evans said a student does not have to be attending summer school to be an adviser. She also said being an adviser would not require a lot of time. Besides the six-hour training session, there are only two other time requirements.

One is meeting with new students for the two-hour sessions on Mondays and Thursdays at 7:30 p.m. The other is checking in at the Off-Campus Center once each week

Evans said peer advisers are a source of information for new students and the sessions are designed to give students an opportunity to familiarize themselves with the University in an informal way.
