

But will RAF lab agree?

'Nessie' seen on TV film

DRUMNADROCHIT, Scotland
— The television film shows a mys-

terious object swimming a zig-zag trail on the surface of Loch Ness. Evidence at last of the monster that legend has lurking in depths of Britain's deepest lake? Not so, says the British Broadcasting Corp.

Nevertheless, it is submitting film of the black speck on the lake for analysis by the photographic laboratories of the Royal Air Force to try to determine what it was. The film was given a nationwide screening Tuesday. It shed little light on whether there is a Loch

Ness monster — known as "Nessie" — and the BBC concluded, "All we can say for sure is that the mystery of the monster is far from solved."

The sighting was made Monday while a photographer, his wife and a BBC reporter drove along the shore of Loch Ness on another assignment.

The photographer noticed the object's V-shaped wash about 1 mile south of the ruins of Urquhart Castle and in the area of reported — but

not substantiated — past sightings of the monster.

The film showed a small speck about the size of a football zig-zagging back and forth on the surface for about 10 minutes.

Conditions were ideal. The afternoon was still and clear and there was scarcely a ripple on the water.

The sighting rekindled interest in the legend of the Loch Ness monster that has attracted serious scientific interest in recent years.

After an electronic expedition that showed possible signs of large unidentified bodies moving through the 900-foot depths, Dr. Robert Rines of the Boston-based Academy of Applied Science last month announced plans to use porpoises with cameras strapped to their backs to locate them.

At least 4,000 sightings of the "monster," resembling a giant horned sea serpent, have been reported since the 1930s.
