The sighting rekindled interest in


the legend of the Loch Ness monster that has attracted serious scientific interest in recent years.

After an electronic expedition that showed possible signs of large unidentified bodies moving through the 900-foot depths, Dr. Robert Rines of the Boston-based Academy of Applied Science last month announced plans to use porpoises with cameras strapped to their backs to locate them.

At least 4,000 sightings of the "monster," resembling a giant horned sea serpent, have been reported since the 1930s.




