Texas border towns are making it even more difficult, according to one legal expert. Quinton Cross of the Texas Legal Services Center says the difficulties arise from the translation of the term "notary public." A "notario publico" in Mexico must undergo a strict examination, be an attorney and is con-sidered to hold influential status in society.

By comparison, the only requirements a notary public must meet in Texas are to be at least 18 years old, a U.S. citizen, a resident of the state, pay a \$1,000 bond, and receive the secretary of state's approval to possess a notary seal.

"These people go to the notaries here thinking they have the same powers as those in Mexico," Cross said.

United Press International WASHINGTON — Government officials told Congress Wednesday the troubled Three Mile Island nuclear power plant is no longer of urgent concern and Middletown, Pa., area residents have received only as much radiation as two chest X-rays.






