Jury sentences Cuevas to die for killing librarian

HOUSTON — Making its decision by law and not by conscience, a jury Thursday sentenced Ignacio Cuevas to die by injection for causing the 1974 death of a Huntsville prison librarian during an escape attempt led by Fred Gomez Carrasco.

Cuevas, 47, showed no emotion as, for the second time, he was sentenced to death for the Aug. 3, 1974, killing of Julia Standley.

Cuevas' first trial and death sentence in 1975 were overturned by a Texas appeals court because of an error in jury selection. The latest capital murder conviction and death sentence also will be appealed automatically.

Cuevas was the only one of three Huntsville prison inmates to survive as the rebels, who had held hostages in a prison library for 11 days, attempted escape inside a makeshift shield fashioned from bulletin boards and law books. They were met by water from fire hoses and

finally a barrage of Texas Rangers' bullets.

Evidence indicated a bullet from another inmate's gun killed Mrs. Standley, but Texas law dictated Cuevas could be tried for capital murder as an accomplice.

Rangers said that, before they fired on the shield, they heard the muffled gunshots of the hostages being killed.

To return a death sentence, the jury had to find Cuevas intentionally killed Mrs. Standley.

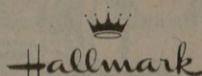

Tough infant lives

Gorilla over ill

OMAHA, Neb. — For a 4-month-old gorilla, Murphy probably feels like he's gone through a lifetime of medical treatment.

"This little guy nearly died on us four or five times," Henry Doorly Zoo Director Lee Simmons says.

"We named him Murphy after Murphy's Law, because absolutely everything that could have gone wrong with him did, but he toughed it out and survived. Now, he's finally in gear.

"We did a whole lot of things that have never been done with gorillas before. We tried four different experimental diets, and he was over 6 weeks old before we finally got him back to birth weight."

Pumps kept Murphy's blood flowing and gave him basic nutrients, but his stomach and intestinal trouble prevented him from eating.

From a birth weight of 4 pounds, 11 ounces, he dropped to 3 pounds, 9 ounces from loss of water.

Murphy then contracted pneumonia and doctors discovered a heart murmur, a condition in which one of the valves fails to close completely as the heart pumps.

The gorilla was taken to Childrens Memorial Hospital and pediatricians specializing in heart and digestive surgery were called in.

A fire swept through the zoo's nursery Jan. 13. Murphy's sister, Tara, was killed as well as a South American cat and several rare birds.

"He's rough, tough and independent, and he loves a crowd," Simmons said. "He's just like his old man."

Murphy, born last December, is the son of Casey the gorilla. "Because we've put in so much time and effort and emotion," Simmons said, "he's become rather special to us."

"He's our first little male gorilla and he acts like it," Simmons said. "He's the macho type."
