"The majority of our phone calls are complaints about excessive noise, turning trash cans over and things like that," Gerzik said.

'Health reasons include those for picking up vicious or diseased ani-Gerzik said, "We get very few of them.

The only way to decrease the number of strays, both in and out of the pounds and shelters, according to the National Humane Society, is to decrease the birth rate of domes-

tic pets.

The society stresses the need to spay or neuter dogs and cats to slow their population growth which, in turn, could reduce the number of

The animals are held for the owners to pick up for five days and after that, the animals are put up for adoption until the eighth day, Gerzik said. "If nobody picks them up by then, our animals are sent to the Texas A&M Veterinary Research Center," he said.

The fate of the animals is uncertain once they leave the pound to be involved in research. "I guess you could say our unclaimed animals are Gerzik said, "Most dog pounds don't have a research center nd, compared to the 1,574 cap-d in 1978.
