# Kennedy, Carter rift widens

profits tax is shaping up as the latest and possibly most bitter - issue to split President Carter and his potential rival for the presidential nomination, Sen. Edward Kennedy.

Kennedy has broken with Carter before, over national health insurance and budget priorities, but the current dispute over oil price decon-trol and how to tax the oil companies' profits left a visibly angry Carter and a stone-faced Kennedy trading charges and counter-charges Monday.

In a speech to the American Society of Newspaper Editors in New York, Kennedy accused the administration of giving in to "the overbear-

ing power of the oil lobby. First, it has intimidated the administration into throwing in the towel without even entering the ring on oil price decontrol," Kennedy

"And second, it has also intimi-dated the administration into submitting a token windfall tax that is no more than a transparent fig leaf over the vast profits the industry will

When a reporter related Kennedy's statement to Carter at his televised and broadcast news conference, the president looked angry and said, "That's just a lot of






