In a statement released about six hours after the Federal Aviation Administration order revoked the aircraft's flying certificate, McDonnell Douglas also said it is still has confidence in the aircraft's design.

The aircraft company also said that some of the problems in wing mounts of the DC-10s jet engines have probably resulted from improper maintenance procedures by air-

"Suspension of the DC-10 type certificate by FAA is an extreme and unwarranted act in the light of salient facts that have emerged during

"McDonnell Douglas reaffirms its faith in the integrity of the DC-10 design. The company is making and reinstallation during mainteevery effort to assure a prompt return to service of the DC-10 and will take whatever steps are necessary to accomplish this.
