80 Americans flee Managua

MANAGUA, Nicaragua — Eighty Americans were evacuated from Nicaragua Wednesday aboard a U.S. Air Force plane that took off from President Anastasio Somoza's private airfield.

In Managua, hungry looters cleared food stores and supermarkets as food shortages in the capital became more acute. Transportation networks have been cut-off into the capital after four days of fighting between Sandinista guerrillas and national guard troops.

Earlier Wednesday Somoza again repeated in an American television interview that he would not resign and claimed that despite continuing fighting in major cities including the capital "the country in general terms is at peace."

(In Washington, Secretary of State Cyrus Vance disclosed that the United States has asked Somoza to "reflect carefully and deeply" on avoiding a radical takeover in Nicaragua — but declined to say whether Washington suggested Somoza resign.)

(At a news conference, Vance also proposed that the Organization of American States call for a cease-fire in Nicaragua and for an end to the

supply of foreign arms to both Somoza's National Guard and the leftist Sandinista guerrillas.)

About 80 American dependents drove in a 17-car convoy from the U.S. ambassador's residence to Somoza's Pacific coast Montelimar Airport, where they boarded the C-130 Hercules turboprop transport for the flight to Howard Air Force Base in the Panama Canal Zone.

Sixty-one other Americans were evacuated safely on Tuesday from the same airfield.

A group of foreign reporters following the convoy were blocked

from entering the city. Nicaraguan soldiers after American Marines fled, ordered Somoza's troops to withdraw in the morning from the embassy details in Managua.

Among the Americans was Xavier Zavala, a moderate Broad Opposition leader. Zavala's wife is American.

Somoza, interviewed on television program "Good America," said he did not request aid from the United States that American officials asked to stop the fighting.

Mexican pipeline still idle

MEXICO CITY — A pipeline originally built by the U.S. Department of Energy is still idle four months after it was inaugurated, the newspaper reported Wednesday.

The 748-mile Cactus-Resaca pipeline was stopped a day from petroleum southern Mexico to the Reynosa on the U.S. border where most of the gas was transported to the United States.

But construction of the pipeline was stopped 70 miles of the border after the administration vetoed the \$2.60 per cubic foot asking price.

President Jose Lopez Portillo inaugurated the pipeline four years ago, but to date it has not produced because of technical difficulties and a shortage of specialized pipes, Excerpt

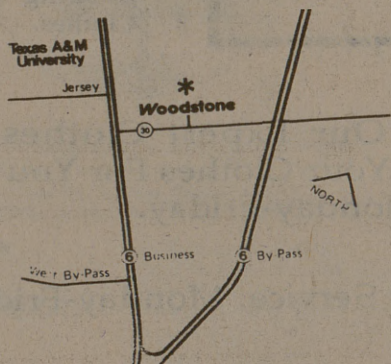
The English-language Today newspaper said Valdez Jr., 19, and Lean O whose parents objected marriage, left behind a "last request" that they be buried in the same grave.
