CS looks over revised budget

The College Station City Council reviewed and discussed a report of budget revisions for the 1979-80 budget in a quiet, almost solemn special session Wednesday afternoon.

Assistant City Manager in charge of finance Van Vandiver presented the report to the council.

The report dealt with revisions of the general city fund and the revenue sharing fund.

The general city fund is made up of permit fees, ad valorem taxes and other city-generated and maintained capital spent on city services.

The revenue sharing fund is made up of federal money. It is used for a variety of purposes by the city and supplements the general city fund.

There is \$3,999,956 available in the general fund this year, according to the report. The basic general fund request is \$3,737,944. That amount includes a cost of living provision of \$168,600 (7 percent) and a \$100,000 contingency provision.

The contingency provision is set aside to cover unexpected expenditures during the upcoming fiscal year, said City Manager North Bardell.

The general fund budget also includes supplemental expenditures of \$303,139.

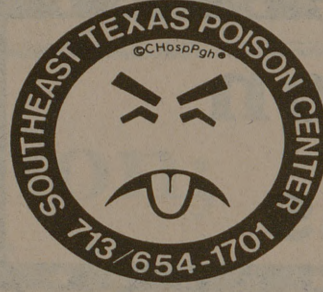
The supplemental costs outlined in the report are mainly salaries for city employees.

As a result of the supplemental costs, the general fund falls \$41,000 short of what is needed, Vandiver said.

To eliminate this deficit, he said, \$30,000 being spent to renovate Easterwood airport will be paid with revenue sharing funds and \$11,000 originally earmarked for the fire department is being delayed until it can be paid with contingency funds.

The Easterwood funds are the second installment of a three-year payment for renovation and use of Easterwood Airport.

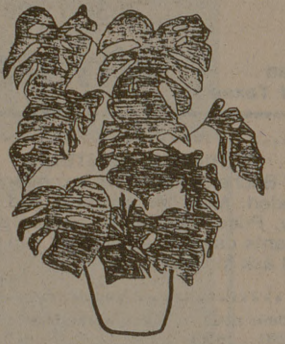
The revenue sharing funds, totaling \$389,288, are planned for \$242,000 in general fund supplements and \$12,400 in sanitation fund supplements.

KANM to return during summer

FM radio listeners will have another alternative on cable in a few weeks when KANM-FM returns to the air.

Todd Gross, KANM station manager, said he hoped the station would be back on the radio for the first day of classes of the second summer session.

The station went off the air in the fall of 1978 because of a minor explosion that damaged the broadcast board. The station was scheduled to open again in the spring, but rebuilding the board took longer than expected, Gross said.

Another problem was a move from old studios in Briarwood apartments to a new location in the B-lounge between Crocker and Moore dormitories. Problems with phone lines between the new studio and the cable companies caused further problems, but Gross said this has been worked out and the station is close to working again.

Friday, July 13, is the projected date to resume operations, but the station could go back on the cable sooner if all the minor problems with phone lines are fixed, he said.

The station will be moving its frequency from 89.1 to 99.9 and will be in stereo, he said.

The main problem now is getting a staff together to run the station, Gross said.

Disc jockeys usually work one four-hour shift a week, and a broadcast license is not needed to work on the station, he said.

The station has a progressive format, playing all types of music except disco, Gross said.

"We are getting more and more interest in the station. If we can get enough workers at the station, we would love to be on 24 hours. In the spring we had an organizational meeting for the fall, and all the spots were filled. I hope we can generate enough interest to fill all the spots this summer," he said.

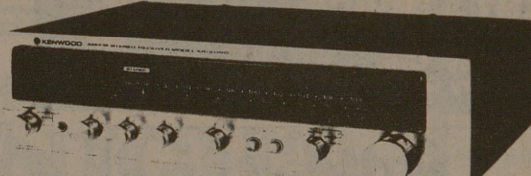

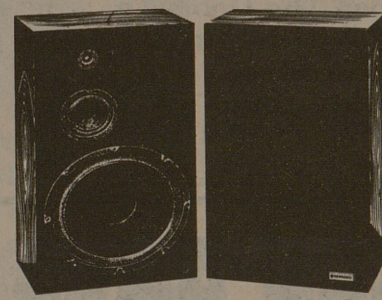

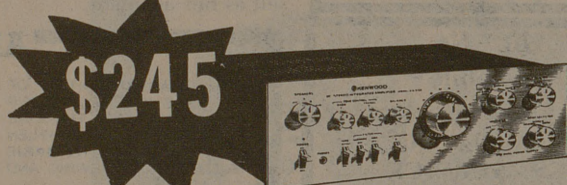
