Cost of driving high before \$1-a-gallon gas

DETROIT — The cost of driving soaked up more than one-quarter of the nation's personal income in 1978 — the highest percentage ever — months before Americans began facing the reality of \$1-a-gallon gasoline, a new study shows.

The study, released Sunday by the Hertz Corp. rental and leasing car agency, put the average cost of owning and operating a car or truck at \$2,027, a record 17.7 percent increase over 1977.

Total spending on vehicle use

amounted to \$442.6 billion — \$248.1 billion on passenger cars alone — or a record 25.9 percent of the nation's personal income.

This translates to nearly 30 cents a mile per vehicle, up 13.6 percent from the 27.1-cent-a-mile average for 1977. When cars alone are gauged, the per-mile expenditure amounted to 22.8 cents, a 10.2 percent increase from 20.7 cents in 1977.

The survey covered all cars and trucks on the road, not just new vehicles.

The increased costs do not mean the recent surge in fuel prices in 1978, spending on fuel increased just 8 percent to \$79 billion, or one-fifth of total vehicle costs.

Hertz attributed nearly four-fifths of the increase, or \$35 billion, to higher expenses with virtually all aspects of — new car costs, insurance premiums, interest rates, fuel, maintenance.

The remainder of the increase from a 4.4 percent increase in the number of cars and trucks on the road — a total of more than 100 million in 1978. Per-unit driving costs declined by more than 10 percent because of the increase in the number of families with more than one vehicle.

The largest expense was depreciation — the difference between purchase price and value — amounting to \$11 billion, more than one-quarter of ownership and operating costs, an increase of \$16 billion in 1977.

Cost of insurance, less other fees increased \$2.1 billion, the largest of any category, to nearly \$100 billion. Finance and other interest fees rose more than \$10 billion to \$2.2 billion, and repairs and maintenance rose by \$14 billion, almost \$100 billion.

Increased truck sales accounted for most of the rise in the percentage of personal income spent on driving. Hertz said light-duty vans, pickups and other vehicles used for personal transportation accounting for nine of 10 sales.

Skylab wavers; wastes fuel

WASHINGTON — Skylab wavered in orbit because of a computer error Sunday, causing automatic systems to draw from a dwindling supply of control jet gas to stabilize it, the space agency reported Monday.

The 78.5-ton space station, expected to fall back to Earth around July 15, spent about four hours in the wrong position before controllers returned it to its sideways style of orbital travel.

The abandoned orbiting laboratory was maneuvered into the broadside position last Wednesday to keep it from tumbling out of control so engineers may be able to keep it from falling over heavily populated areas.

The orientation increased the atmospheric drag on the spacecraft and Skylab's orbit has descended eight miles in five days. It was reported about 155 miles high Monday.
