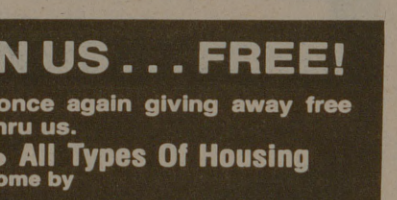

# the state Jury convicts Estes of tax fraud scheme

 DALLAS — Texas conman Billie Sol Estes Wednesday was found guilty on charges of fraud and tax evasion in a scheme involving non-existent oil field equipment cleaners, but was declared innocent on other charges in the complex federal case and the jury said it could not make a decision on yet other charges.

The jury, which began considering evidence last Thursday, said Estes was guilty of one count of mail fraud but was innocent of three other fraud counts in that indictment. It also ruled Estes and co-defendant James K. Horton were guilty of tax evasion.

After reading those partial verdicts the jury resumed deliberation on the remaining fraud charges, returning a short time later to announce it would not be able to reach a decision.

Judge Robert Hill declared a mistrial on those charges and set sentencing for the fraud and tax counts for Aug. 6.

"We are convinced we cannot reach a verdict. Every member of jury made honest effort to reach verdict," said jury foreman Ernest Cotton. "We've been over every scrap of paper in there (jury room)."

Hill said the jury had worked long enough on the case and dismissed it. "I have no choice but to declare a mistrial," he said. "I don't think I've ever had a jury that approached a case more seriously and more conscientiously than this one."

Estes, 51, remained impassive as the trial came to an end but his two daughters, who had testified to the family's poverty, cried when the verdicts were returned. Estes' married daughter, Pam Telfer, fainted in women's room of courthouse before she knew the jury had returned deadlocked on the final charges.

There were a total of 22 charges lodged against Estes and Horton, a business associate. The government claimed the two leased oil field cleaning equipment to oil companies but that the cleaners did not exist.

The jury ruled Estes and Horton were guilty of evading \$10 million worth of taxes and that they had used the mails to promote their scheme.

But it was unable to reach a decision on the heart of the prosecution case — whether Estes and Horton had bilked three leasing companies out of \$600,000 through leasing nonexistent steam cleaners.

Estes, who built a huge real estate empire during the late 1950s and early 1960s, was convicted in 1964 of swindling West Texas through mortgages on non-existent fertilizer tanks and sentenced to 10 years in jail. He was paroled 18 months later.

 PECOS, Texas — Past associates of Billie Sol Estes were released Wednesday to discuss the guilty verdict handed down against the paroled swindler by a Dallas jury.

A long-time Pecos businessman, who refused to be identified, served that the current troubles faced by the town's most infamous former resident had been overlooked for the most part.

"I think you could say most of the people here just don't give a damn," he said. "We just went through hell there for awhile. We had a baptism of fire, so everybody here would just rather forget about it."

A.B. Foster, a former associate, was blunt in his response. "I think you're asking questions that you shouldn't ask. Everybody's human. I have no comment."

Ruel Alexander, a former director for Superior Manufacturing Co. who built anhydrous ammonia tanks, served 25 months of a six-year sentence when he became entangled in an Estes web in the early 1960s.

Now an Amarillo businessman, Alexander said he had been affected "privately" by Wednesday's verdict, but he declined to elaborate.

"That whole thing is behind me," he said. "I do my best to forget about it and most of my friends and people I deal with have forgotten about it. I'd really rather it remain that way if you don't mind."

Another Estes friend from the old days, realtor W.W. "Burr" Teague of Pecos, said, "I've washed my hands of it a long time ago" and declined further comment.

# Tourists not affected by cave take over

 CARLSBAD, N.M. — Tourists at Carlsbad Caverns Wednesday were interested, but not overly worried, about the alleged occupation of an underground room at the caverns, a National Park Service official said.

The takeover of the lunch room, 750 feet below the surface, by four men Tuesday afternoon and evening

also did not appear to have had any effect on the number of visitors to the caverns Wednesday.

"More than half of the visitors don't mention it," said Rick Crisman, supervisor of the information services at the visitor's center. "Those who do say something like, 'It was kind of exciting day, wasn't it?'"

"At least a third of them have never even heard about it," Crisman said. "Many vacationers don't turn on their radios when they travel."

"People tend to view it as a conversion incident that probably will happen again, they hope."

Bob Crisman of the national park service said the damage to the caverns and facilities during the occupation was minor, although a \$100,000 estimate had been made.

Crisman, who said NPS officials would be meeting to discuss the methods of improving security at the caverns, said a few bullets struck rock walls in the caverns and a door leading to an elevator shaft in the area, a movie screen and a railing had bullet holes.

One of the stalactites, stalagmites or other natural formations in the caverns, one of the major tourist attractions in the Southwest, was damaged, he said.

"We are to be having a meeting to see what measures we could take to increase security without disturbing the visitors," Crisman said. "I don't want to start searching everyone."

"I am sure everyone will be alert in the future for this type of thing, realizing it can happen anywhere."

Crisman said Linda Phillips, seasonal park employee from Chattanooga, Tenn., who was held captive by the gunmen for nearly 12 hours, had been given the day off. "She's doing well, but she needs a day to recuperate," he said.

# 2 more counties odd-even

 AUSTIN — Gov. Bill Clements announced Wednesday he has signed an order officially adding Johnson and Matagorda counties to the state's odd-even gasoline ration plan.

Clements' chief energy advisor, Ed Vetter, had said last week Matagorda County would be included in the plan, but Wednesday's announcement is the first time Johnson County also will be added, bringing to 16 the number of counties affected by the rationing system.

Matagorda and Johnson counties were added to the plan Tuesday, officially go under the plan today.
