Use fan with air conditioner

A&M researcher gives tips for staying cool in summer

A floor fan or even an old oscillating fan can help people live comfortably with home air conditioners set at an energy-conserving 80 degrees.

Home air conditioners have only temperature control, but two other factors — water vapor in the air and air movement — affect comfort. Relative humidity of 50 to 60 percent and air movement are built into units at the factory.

Driscoll said 80 degrees, 60 percent relative humidity and little or no air movement are "right on the edge of the comfort zone that has been defined by extensive research."

In other words, at that combination most people will be comfortable and a few will be slightly uncomfortable, the meteorology professor said.

The simplest and least expensive way to get back into the comfort zone is to step up air movement to get back into the comfort zone," Driscoll said. That's why he recommends the fan comes in. His family has an 18-inch floor fan at low speed with the thermostat at 82 degrees.

There is so much misinformation about thermostat settings, said the professor who describes his specialty as "how climate inside and outdoors affects human well-being."

He believes the worst myth to be believed is that people in high humidity areas

must set the thermostat lower to stay comfortable.

"Before air conditioning, people lived here and in higher humidity areas under much worse conditions," he said. "We've simply gotten used to a cheap energy situation."

Compression-type air cooling becomes energy-wasteful and extra expensive when temperatures controls are lowered to remove more water vapor from the air, the meteorologist observed. Such settings also put conditions at the other side of the comfort zone defined by

temperature, humidity and air movement, around 70 degrees.

Driscoll said at that point most people become equally as uncomfortable, especially if they are not active.

"Comfort is relative," he said. "What's best for an elderly lady with a congestive heart disease will be different from a young man who works in the construction industry or plays golf or tennis regularly."

But even for someone raised in the jungles of Brazil, acclimatization occurs and comfort falls inside the comfort zone.

Insect could be threat to Texas

The assassin bug, known for its blood-sucking snout, has become a mild threat to Texans because it is infected with a sometimes fatal parasitic disease passed along to its victims, said Texas A&M University veterinary pathologists Gail D. Williams and L. Garry Adams.

As a result, campers, picnickers and other outdoors lovers flocking to warm weather haunts this summer should be aware of the night-feeding insect which transmits the infection by defecating in or near the wound it just opened with its snout.

The infection, known as Chagas' disease or American trypanosomiasis, is often fatal in infants and young animals.

Human adults react in a varied manner. Some may need only a couple of bites to become affected while others' body defenses may successfully fight off a number of bites.

It is possible that Chagas' disease is best transmitted between June

and September, but that's no guarantee, say the Texas A&M scientists.

The ailment continues to be diagnosed among pets and wildlife in Central Texas, primarily dogs, raccoons and possums.

Three human cases have been recorded in Texas since 1955, one last year in Houston.

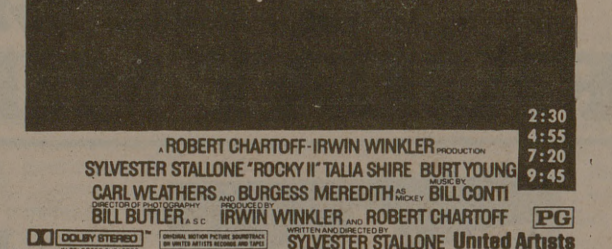

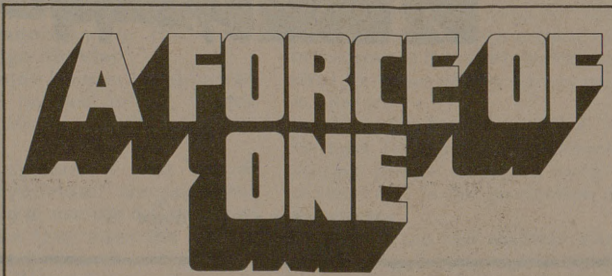
