

'Students who receive degrees in engineering with cooperative education experience start at better salaries," said Dr. Charles A. Rodenberger, assistant dean of engi-

He found in a survey of companies

A&M that "co-op" participation leads to \$600 to \$1,200 a year more in starting salaries.

The findings support the idea that a cooperative education student will be a more valuable asset to industry at the time of graduation than would be a non-experienced graduate, Rodenberger said
