## Mental health center sold

The Bluebonnet Psychiatric Center changed ownership Wednesday and is now called the Greenleaf Psychiatric Center.

The change involves more than a change in name, however. Bluebonnet was bought by Psychiatric Centers International, Inc. (PCI), a private organization, and now becomes a private psychiatric hospital. It had previously been funded by federal grants. The federal money ran out this year.

"Bluebonnet received an eight-year staffing and operating grant," said Don Sweeney, a member of Greenleaf's board of directors, explaining the center's financial difficulties. "These grants are designed to support the hospital until it can absorb the costs on its own. After the grant ran out, Bluebonnet didn't have enough business to stay on its feet."

The sale of the psychiatric hospital raised \$525,000 and the money will go into a trust fund. The interest from this fund will be used to help the mental health services, primarily for the care of indigents.

This interest will amount to about \$40,000 per year in addition to the \$30,000 provided by the State Board of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, Sweeney said. This amount doubles the old budget for indigent care.

Greenleaf's new administrator, Kay Sanders, said they will "give the building a face-lift. We're in the process of deciding just exactly how much we'll do."

Sanders said they plan on renovating the interior and exterior and adding more recreation and activity therapy space including possibly a swimming pool. When the remodeling is finished, she added, Greenleaf will be "a first-class private clinic."

Greenleaf will still have all the same services, Sanders said, but they will concentrate more on inpatient care. "We are retaining all staff who desire to stay," she said, "but we are looking for nurses." She added that the staff at Greenleaf will stress further development of mental health care.
