Medical award given to student

For the second consecutive year, a researcher in Texas A&M University's College of Medicine has received the Harold Lamport Foundation Award honoring the nation's outstanding young cardiovascular investigator.

Glen Lane, graduate student in medical physiology, is the 1979 recipient for his work on the interstitial space between cells and the

lymphatic vessels that drain that space.

No other college of medicine or research center is believed to have won the Lamport Award twice consecutively.

In 1978, associate professor Dr. Harris Granger won the Lamport Award for his work on fluid balances.

Lane, 29, is a graduate of Garden Grove (Calif.) High School. He completed a bachelor's degree in microbiology and master's degree in physics at the University of Southwestern Louisiana before coming to

Texas A&M.

He has been granted a National Institutes of Health postdoctoral fellowship to continue his work here.

Faculty members given dean posts

Two long-time faculty members have been confirmed by the Board of Regents to top administrative posts at Texas A&M University.

Dr. Clinton Phillips, 54, was named associate dean of the College of Business Administration and Dr. Davis A. Fahlgren, 53, was named assistant dean for academic affairs in the College of Geosciences. Both appointments are effective September 1.

Phillips joined the Texas A&M faculty in 1967 as a professor of finance and served the past year as interim dean of the college of business. He received his doctorate from Vanderbilt University.

Fahlgren came to the university in 1963 after receiving a Ph.D. from Massachusetts Institute of Technology and served most recently as a

professor of geophysics and oceanography. He succeeds Dr. Joseph Sonnenfeld who is returning to fulltime teaching and research.

New engineering head appointed

Dr. Donald McDonald, a member of the Texas A&M faculty since 1973, took over Aug. 11 as head of the Department of Civil Engineering.

The appointment was announced

by Vice President for Academic Affairs Dr. J. M. Prescott.

More than 80 faculty teach in five civil engineering groups devoted to studies in coastal, hydraulic and ocean engineering, environmental engineering, construction, materials and structural engineering, geoenvironmental and civil systems engineering. Many civil engineering faculty members also hold joint appointments in the Texas Transportation Institute and the Texas Engineering Experiment Station.

McDonald, with industrial managerial and senior research experi-

ence with the Lockheed Missiles and Space Co., held joint appointment in the experiment station. The 48-year-old structural dynamics specialist is a registered professional engineer and taught earlier at North Carolina State University. He is a 1952 graduate of Auburn University and also earned master's and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Illinois.

McDonald succeeds Dr. Charles Samson Jr. who returns to fulltime teaching and will serve this year as president of the Southwest Conference.

Professor named to committee

Dr. Paul B. Crawford, Texas A&M University petroleum engineering professor, has been appointed to the research committee of the Interstate Oil Compact Commission by Gov. William P. Clements Jr.

The commission is an organization of more than 30 petroleum producing states dedicated to the efficient utilization and conservation of oil and gas.

Crawford is assistant director of the Texas Petroleum Research Committee and widely known for studies in secondary and tertiary methods of oil recovery.

His work in perfecting means of recovering additional oil from previously-produced formations has been described widely by the engineer. A recent presentation on use of a small slug of carbon dioxide pushed by low temperature nitrogen was made before the IOCC committee in Lexington, Ky.

A Texas A&M faculty member since 1952, Crawford graduated from Texas Tech in 1943 and received the master's and Ph.D. degrees at the University of Texas.
