



Boom-bust Farm policy boosts Carter image

United Press International MARSHALLTOWN, Iowa — Republicans — at least for the time being — generally have abandoned hope of faulting Jimmy Carter on farm policy

Instead, they are using other issues, especially energy and infla-tion, to color the administration's claims of having boosted farm in-come 40 percent last year, raised exports to record levels and taken "boom and bust" out of farming. 'The chief enemy of farmers is inflation," said Earl Butz, agriculture secretary under Richard Nixon and Gerald Ford. "Their costs go up and stay up and they'll see that even with the way Carter's farm program has worked, he hasn't done anything about inflation.




