Suit challenges Texas law

Court is guardian of fetus

HOUSTON — A pregnant woman whose efforts to gain abortion referral information resulted in a court appointing a guardian for her fetus, is now the focus of a federal suit challenging the constitutionality of Texas' guardianship laws.

The American Civil Liberties Union Tuesday added the "Jane Doe" case to an earlier suit filed on behalf of "Jane Woe."

The ACLU suit attacked the guardianship laws as generally unconstitutional, alleging that a judge may

issue temporary guardianship without holding a hearing, without receiving any evidence, without giving notice to the person for whom guardianship is sought and without the person being represented by a lawyer.

Harris County Probate Judge Bill Bear last week granted Eileen Brady guardianship of the Jane Doe fetus.

In a sworn statement accompanying the suit, Jane Doe said that on Aug. 31 she called the Abortion Abuse Advice and Information Service to find out "where I might see-

ing a safe abortion." She said she was told she would receive abortion clinic information through the mail.

"I have reason to believe that the Abortion Abuse Advice and Information Service disclosed my name to the persons who have subjected me to (guardianship) litigation," the statement said.

ACLU lawyer Matthew Horowitz said the abortion information office was operated by a so-called right-to-life group and identified Brady as an anti-abortionist.

After receiving guardianship of the fetus, Brady filed suit before state District Judge William Kilgarrin seeking to stop Jane Doe, who is 10 weeks pregnant, from having an abortion.

Robber: job was inspired by tip in Time

OKLAHOMA CITY — An admitted bank robber Tuesday told a federal judge he was encouraged to pull the heist by an recent article in Time magazine.

Richard Lynn Snow, 30, told U.S. District Judge Ralph Thompson he read an article that said bank tellers "always give you the money" when threatened with physical harm.

He was apparently convinced by the article and walked unarmed into the Founders Bank and Trust Co. last week. He walked away from the bank with \$3,613 after passing a threatening note to a teller.

He told the judge he wants to pay back the bank, but only had \$870 from the robbery. Snow reportedly bought about \$1,500 in stereo equipment and a camera soon after the robbery.

Kennedy son to be treated for addiction

NEW YORK — David Kennedy, the son of the late Robert F. Kennedy, reportedly will be placed in a metropolitan area hospital for treatment of drug addiction.

The New York Daily News reported Wednesday the Harvard dropout turned himself in to Kennedy family members Tuesday after running away from the family compound in Hyannis Port, Mass., on Monday.

The paper earlier reported Kennedy, 24, was brought to the compound by his uncle, Stephen Kennedy, a day after he was reported to be robbed of \$30 in a seedy hotel known to police as a heroin addicts' hangout.
