

United Press International NEW DELHI, India — Former Afghanistan President Nor Mohammad Taraki was forced out of power by his successor and may have been wounded in the culmination of a long-standing personal power struggle, diplomatic sources said Monday.

Prime Minister Hafizollah Amin Sunday assumed control of Af-ghanistan, which has been torn by civil strife between Moslems and the pro-Moscow communist regime. Visitors who returned to New

Delhi during the weekend from Kabul said Monday Taraki, 62, may have been wounded in a shoot-out coup Friday.

There were rumors at high levels

that four people were killed in shooting in the People's Palace Friday," one visitor from Kabul said. "There were also rumors Taraki was shot and injured." The reports could not be confirmed by diplomatic sources who also had heard them.

Taraki resigned Sunday citing health and asked Amin to take over, television and radio reports controlled by Kabul said.

Taraki and Amin had no visible differences in ideology, religion or their loyalty to Moscow, diplomatic sources said

Both are hard-line Marxists, heavily dependent on Moscow and moderate Moslems.

But diplomatic sources said the power struggle between the two was evident shortly after the military coup that put them in power. Amin, who became foreign minis-

er when Taraki overthrew and killed President Mohammad Daoud in April 1978, virtually took control of the country in March, when Taraki named him first minister.

Amin, who is known to be both ambitious and ruthless, was scheduled to speak to the nation Monday evening. "In view of the relationship be-

MEXICO CITY — At least seven people died and 15 were a riously injured early Monday in a three-bus pileup on a highway & miles east of Mexico City, federal highway police said.

Police said the accident occurred when the first bus in a three-b caravan went out of control around a snaking curve on the road to a city of Puebla. The other two buses could not stop in time and place on top of each other.

Nearly a dozen Red Cross rescue squads rushed to the scene of the accident and pulled out seven bodies and at least 15 injured from the twisted remains of the vehicles, police said.

#### Nerve gas found; evacuation ordered

HAMBURG, West Germany — Authorities Monday evacuated people from their homes and closed 60 factories near an abandons explosives factory, where military experts began clearing out more

than 500 tons of munitions and poison gas. Military experts in gas masks carried away the highly poisons G.A. Gas, a nerve gas manufactured during World War II and four in the deserted compound.

Police learned of the arms and gas cache after a boy was killed and two others severely injured while playing with explosives. The boy had entered the factory area through a broken fence.
