WASHINGTON — The Senate Foreign Relations Committee Monday approved the nomination of Robert Krueger of Texas to be special coordinator for U.S.-Mexican affairs.

Krueger's nomination, approved 9-6, now goes to the full Senate. Acting Secretary of State Warren Christopher told the committee Krueger's confirmation would improve ties between the United States and Mexico.

"The State Department believes the position to which he (Krueger) is nominated is highly important in more rational and effective approach to U.S.-Mexican relations," Christopher said.

"Robert Krueger is well qualified to fill the position (which) the administration feels is necessary for improving our bilateral relations with Mexico," Krueger, a former Democratic congressman from Texas, was nominated for the new post five months ago. Christopher spoke on his nomination only days before the Washington visit of Mexican President Lopez Portillo.

Christopher made the point that relations between the United States and Mexico — which share a 2,000-mile border — are "quantitatively different from what we have with any other nation."

"More issues span the divide between foreign and domestic concerns, more domestic departments and agencies are involved and more issues directly involve domestic considerations," he said.

As ambassador-at-large and special coordinator for Mexican affairs, Krueger would head the U.S. work being done by eight pre-consultative groups on such areas as energy, trade, finance, industry and development, migration, border issues, law enforcement and tourism.

The work of these consultative groups, set up after Lopez Portillo's first Washington trip in February 1977, will be reviewed by him and President Carter during their meetings in Washington on Friday and Saturday.
