
# WHAT'S UP

### Austin

**TEXAS MEMORIAL MUSEUM:** The Cloisonne and Champleve Enamels Exhibit. Cloisonne and Enamels of the Far East, 19th and 20th centuries are featured. A SURVEY OF NATIVE TEXAS ARTISTS: Lufkin Historical and Creative Arts Center, Lufkin. Organized by the San Antonio Museum Association in 1978, this exhibition includes creations of little-known artists who worked in Texas. Includes blacksmiths, quilt-makers, whittlers, potters, cabinet makers and wood carvers. Through Nov. 11. Museum hours are 10 a.m. -2 p.m. Tuesday-Friday, and 1-5 p.m. Sunday. Free.
