Pope visits St. Peter's

PHILADELPHIA — Pope John Paul II, Catholicism's contemporary St. Peter, visited the Church of St. Peter today to pay tribute to America's only male saint, St. John Neumann.
Under clear autumn skies, the pope entered the church escorted by Cardinal John Krol and was greeted by a warm round of applause. He knelt briefly at the altar, then spoke to the crowd.
John Paul told the congregation that from childhood Neumann had said to God, "I want to be all yours in life. I want to be all yours in death."
"What really matters in life is that we are loved by Christ and that we love him in return," the pope said.
"In comparison to the love of Jesus, everything else is secondary, and without the love of Jesus everything else is useless."
"May St. John Neumann pray for us and may we be strengthened in our love for Jesus Christ, Our Lord."
The church erupted into applause and cheers but grew silent when the pope raised his arms and prayed in

Latin. At the end of the service said, "Muy Bien!" (Very Good).
The pope arrived at the Church of St. Peter at 7:40 a.m. EDT. The motorcade travelled down Chestnut Avenue at a brisk pace, and the pope, perhaps due to the clear morning, did not stand through the roof of his limousine but waved from within.
The pope's address at St. Peter's was made in English and Spanish and was piped to hundreds of persons outside the church.
Teri Labree, 19, of Philadelphia's Fishtown section, was sitting in a wheelchair in a corner outside the church. The pope went over to her and blessed her and gave her a kiss on the cheek.
"I feel fantastic!" she beamed. "He blessed me and I shook his hand and said thank you. I was holding a little bit. It was a wonderful thing, the joy that I could not walk again."
She has had meningitis when she was 9 1/2 months old and has walked since.
"It's the most exciting thing in my life," she said.

O'Hair files appeal to prevent mass

WASHINGTON — Atheist Madalyn Murray O'Hair appealed to another court Thursday to stop Pope John Paul II from celebrating mass on Washington's Mall Sunday.
O'Hair took her case to the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia, arguing the mass would violate the separation of church and state guaranteed by the Constitution.
U.S. District Judge Oliver Gasch Wednesday dismissed her suit, which was aimed at blocking the Interior Department and the National Park Service from permitting the mass on public land.
O'Hair, 59, of Austin, Texas, argued in her appeal that government property would become a "church" if the service is permitted.

Supreme Court ruling against prayer in public schools, questioning the stature of Gasch and others, the federal bench.
Interviewed in Chicago, where she plans to picket against the mass during a Friday mass, she said, "federal courts do not have an authority of stature. Gasch is part of a group which would go with the crowd."
The judge, she charged, was pressured by the "power, wealth and political thrust of Roman Catholic church and additional possibility that the government of the United States would be embarrassed if a judge had not acted and said the mass could not be given."
Gasch, a federal judge of 14 years, ruled O'Hair "was unable to cite authority" to support her argument that a religious group should be barred from convening on national lands.
Gasch said the park service had completely avoided any contact with or sponsorship with the mass on the Mall, and it has treated archdiocese (of Washington) like any other applicant for the use of park land.

"By the government permitting a religious service to take place on government property, it will be demonstrating to the world that the U.S. government supports and approves the spiritual content of the Pope's mass," she said.
The appeals court took no immediate action on her case.

Pope laments plight of eastern Christians

PHILADELPHIA — Pope John Paul II appealed for the preservation of Slavic traditions Thursday and lamented the difficulties Christians face in Iron Curtain countries.
Visiting the Ukrainian Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, the pontiff hailed the ethnic traditions of Eastern rite Catholics as "living evidence of the richness of the church."
The modernistic, gold-domed cathedral, headquarters for all Ukrainian Catholics in the United States, is the only Eastern rite church John Paul will see during his week in America. Ukrainian Catholics have maintained their separate liturgy and traditions since 1595.
"For many years I have had high esteem for the Ukrainian people," the pope said.
In a carefully worded reference to religious life in the Soviet bloc, he

added: "I have known of the sufferings and injustices you have endured. These are matters of my concern to me."
John Paul spoke in Ukrainian, English under a blue and red capulet crowned with a mass Christ the Redeemer, traditional symbol of Eastern rite churches.
"I'm also mindful of the struggles Ukrainians face to remain faithful to the gospel and to be in union with the successor to St. Peter," the pope said. "I cannot forget countless Ukrainian martyrs in ancient and more recent times, most of whose names are unknown, who gave their lives rather than abandon their faith. I mention these to show profound esteem for the Ukrainian church."
The pope told those in attendance they were "part of God's household with Christ as its main cornerstone."

She doesn't get papal blessing

ROSLYN, N.Y. — A Polish teen-ager was sent into open-heart surgery Thursday without benefit of a blessing she had hoped to get from Pope John Paul II while he was visiting New York.
The girl, Margaret Granke, 17,

was brought to this country week from Gdansk, Poland, especially for the operation to repair perforation in her heart.
Since the operation coincided with the pope's visit, she wanted a blessing from him.
Irene Piszczatowski of Glen Cove, N.Y., president of the Polish National Home in Glen Cove, who arranged for the operation, said she made many phone calls to St. Patrick's Cathedral but could not get any of the pontiff's aides.
"She took it very well," said Frank Regnante, the director of community relations at St. Francis Hospital in Roslyn.
