Burrus said he hopes areologists will try to find the reins of the old parish church, hich was destroyed in an Indian ges prising 230 years ago.

Historians formerly thought the 1011 first parish churches were estab-ished in the region in 1852, Burrus id. In that year, Franciscan issionaries withdrew from the reon and were replaced by priests


