All-Aggie Rodeo ready to ride

"Ride 'em cowboy" is a cry one would certainly expect to hear around an agricultural college. Texas A&M University is no exception. The Texas A&M University Rodeo Club is an organization of Texas A&M students interested in participating in and helping with rodeos.

Students try for the chance to compete as individuals in the National College Rodeo Finals, said Jim Price, president of the club. The club meets every first and third Tuesday of every month at 7 p.m.

Out of 50 members, 40 participate in rodeo events such as riding, calf roping, barrel racing, steer dodging and team roping. Price, a senior business major from Ingleside.

The rest of the members help with the rodeos that the club sponsors. These include the All-Aggie Rodeo held in the fall and the intercollegiate rodeo held in the spring.

The students sell concessions, and announce the rodeos and help with the rodeo club. Students wishing to join the rodeo club need not participate in rodeos, just show interest in them, he added.

From October to May, there are between 13-15 intercollegiate rodeos in which club members participate. The first one this year being held in Uvalde through Saturday.

Regional contests are held in late May, with Texas A&M participating in the southern region. The top two teams and individuals in the regional contest will qualify to participate in the National College Rodeo Finals which will be held in Lake Charles, La., next year.

Last year several Texas A&M Rodeo Club members qualified for national contests.

Mark Ivey won the southern regional title in tie-down calf roping and went to the national contest. A brother team, Mick and O'Brien, were in the team roping event, and Beverly Acknowledges girl's breakthrough contest.

Each year the club sends a queen contest representative to the national contest also. Texas A&M's representative, Glenda Chapman, a senior management major, placed fourth in last year's contest. A new representative will be selected in the spring.

The club sponsors the All-Aggie Rodeo each fall. This rodeo is a regularly scheduled event that counts toward regional and national contests, but it's held simply for the enjoyment of students and the students of Texas A&M.

This year's All-Aggie Rodeo will be held Oct. 27-28, with performances at 7:30 Friday and Saturday nights at Snook Arena.

Engineers test air quality at intersection near A&M

Engineers have turned a busy intersection near the Texas A&M University campus into an outdoor laboratory measuring pollution from automobile exhausts.

Sensors have been placed at three levels within 10 yards of the intersection to measure temperature, wind, humidity, and barometric pressure and sample the air for quantities of carbon monoxide, non-methane hydrocarbons, nitrogen, the biggest pollutant from auto exhausts.

Loop detectors in the area also provide information on volume and velocity. Data instruments are automatically ordered around the clock by a computer in a van parked nearby. Signal sequences are level computer and later time-series of the intersection will be graphed from the top of the city's 11-story Oceanography Meteorology building.

"We are trying to determine things," explained Dr. Jerry chemical engineering professor and head of the Texas Transportation Institute project. "First, we determine the amount of pollutants emitted by vehicles at the intersection and we want to measure the pollutants dispersed."

From data collected over three months, project leaders hope to anticipate pollution problems in the design of future systems.

SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE

FOR STUDENTS COMPLETING 92 HOURS AT THE END OF THE FALL '79 SEMESTER

TO BE ELIGIBLE TO ORDER THE TEXAS A&M SENIOR RING, AN UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT MUST HAVE AT LEAST NINETY-TWO (92) SEMESTER HOURS, WITH 30 HOURS AT A&M AND BE IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE UNIVERSITY. USING MID-SEMESTER GRADES TO FULFILL THE ABOVE REQUIREMENTS, PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS:

1. MID-SEMESTER ORDERS WILL BE TAKEN ONLY FROM OCT. 29TH UNTIL DEC. 7, 1979.
2. LEAVE YOUR NAME, MAJOR AND I.D. NUMBER WITH THE RING CLERK, HEATON HALL, AT LEAST TWO WEEKS BEFORE YOU PLAN TO ORDER YOUR RING AND NOT LATER THAN NOVEMBER 30TH. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY TELEPHONE.
3. BRING MID-SEMESTER GRADE REPORTS ALONG WHEN READY TO ORDER. WE NEED THIS TO VERIFY PASSING HOURS FOR THE FALL SEMESTER.
4. ANYONE HAVING FAILED TO LEAVE THEIR NAME IN ADVANCE AND FAIL TO BRING THEIR MID-SEMESTER GRADE REPORT WILL BE ASKED TO RETURN AT A LATER DATE TO ALLOW TIME FOR RECORDS TO BE CHECKED.
5. ALL RINGS MUST BE PAID FOR IN FULL WHENEVER THE ORDER IS PLACED. (SENIOR RING LOANS ARE AVAILABLE THROUGH STUDENT FINANCIAL AID IN THE YMCA BUILDING.)

Any student who fails the written examination (EPE) must satisfy the English Proficiency Requirement by taking English 301 and earning a minimum grade of "C".
