**Bombs found in Manhattan party offices**

NEW YORK — Apparent pipe bombs were found in the Democratic and Republican committee offices in midtown Manhattan Thursday, police said. The devices were removed by the bomb squad without incident.

It was not immediately known whether the devices were explosive. An initial police report indicated the device found at the Republican offices had all the components of a bomb, but could

not explode.

A spokeswoman at the Democratic State Committee headquarters on East 42nd Street said the cylindrical device, which was attached to a watch, was found shortly after an anonymous male telephone caller warned that, "There's a bomb in the office — this is no joke."

About 20 minutes later, a similar device was found in the offices of the Republican County Committee.

**Kennedy to form election committee**

WASHINGTON — Sen. Edward Kennedy will form a presidential campaign committee, possibly as early as next week, his press secretary said Thursday.

The "Kennedy for President" committee will likely be headed by his brother-in-law, Stephen Smith, said Tom Southwick in confirming initial reports in Thursday's Wall Street Journal.

Southwick said no timetable has been set for a formal announcement by Kennedy that he will run against President Carter. The committee will be an exploratory group to raise funds and coordinate strategy for a campaign if the Massachusetts Democrat does run, as is widely ex-

pected.

"There are a number of decisions to be made," he said. "Things who is going to run it and who is going to be located."

In addition, Kennedy can openly raise funds for his campaign. Even with a well established law allows individual contributions of no more than \$1,000.

Kennedy forces reportedly to score a symbolic victory by ifying for federal campaign within a record number of days the formation of the committee quality, the campaign will raise \$5,000 in each of 20 contributions of no more than each.

**'Innocent' skit has teacher's job on line**

BATON ROUGE, La. — A teacher at a predominantly white high school has apologized for a skit staged by her students, who wore blackface and portrayed students at a mostly black high school smoking marijuana, snorting cocaine and drinking alcohol.

"I just made a stupid mistake," Alice French, a teacher at Tara High School, said Wednesday. "I'm going to be hanged because of it. I know I deserve some hanging, but the noose is too tight."

The skit was presented last Friday at a football pep rally. Tara played McKinley High School, which is predominantly black, that night.

French's students wore blackface for the skit and were dressed in tat-

tered clothes. One of her students, a male, portrayed a black student named McKinley homecoming.

Several blacks and whites were out during the skit, but French it was meant innocently and she not realize until later that she done something wrong.

"Somebody is trying to catch because of what happens wouldn't hold it against some he had done the same thing, said. "Everybody makes a mistake in this case, I made a big one. My homeroom students wanted to make a fool of themselves to make the pep rally crowd. Something that innocent backfired."
