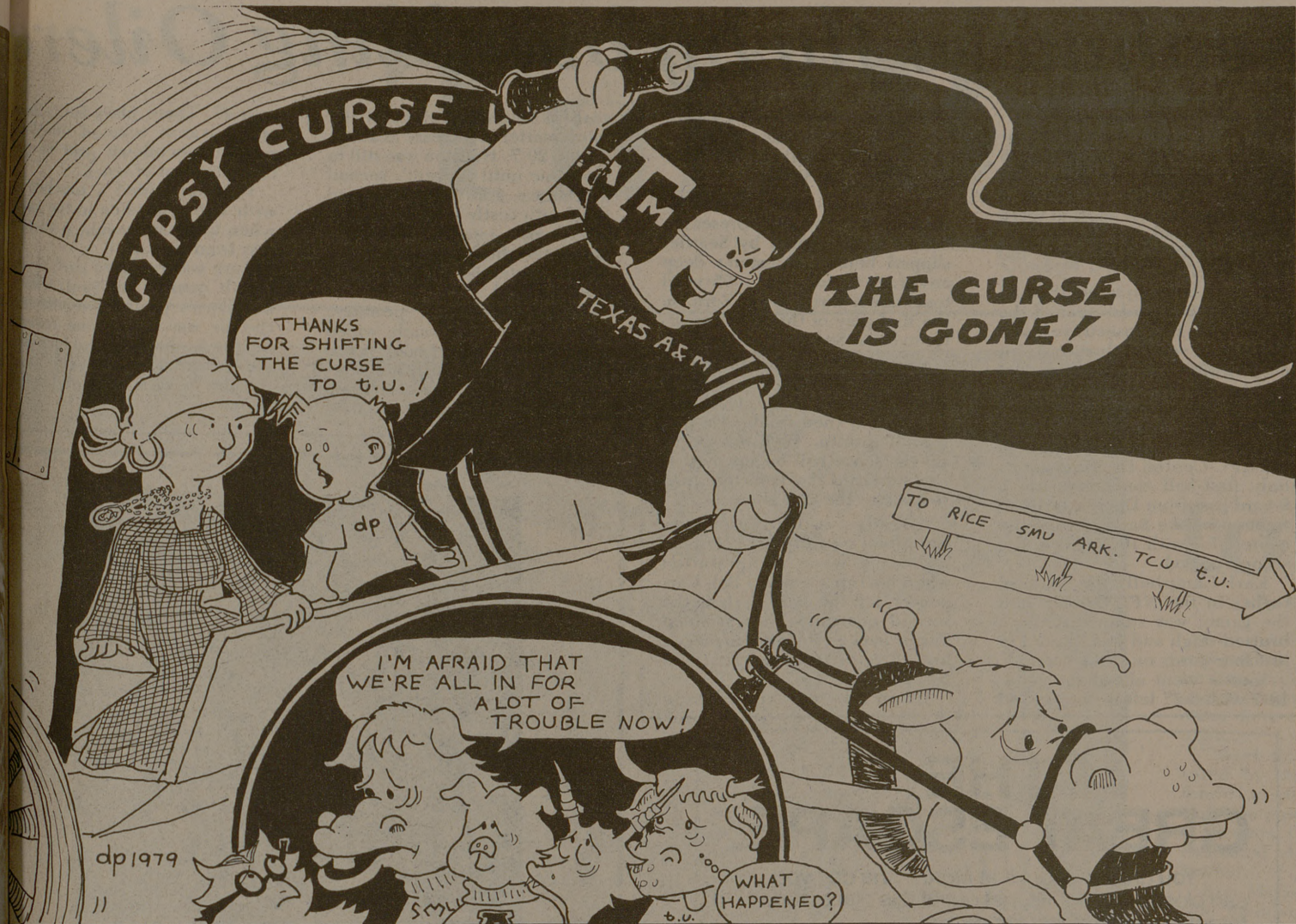

## Holtz works magic; Cougars next trick

For years, Arkansas coach Lou Holtz has had quite a reputation in amateur magician circles since he is very good with the rope trick, can all rings apart and has yanked an occasional Razorback out of the hat.

But, as it turns out, he has an absolute monopoly on magic in Little Rock because the Texas Longhorns couldn't find a single bit of it last Saturday.

The magic had disappeared from Texas' defense and whatever wonderment had been residing in the kit of kicker John Goodson was gone as well.

So the team that looked so indestructible against Oklahoma the week before was destroyed by Arkansas, 17-14, bringing yet another twist to what had been touted all along as a potentially mixed up outwest Conference race.

Things won't be too mixed up in Fayetteville next Saturday. It will be very clear, in fact. The team that has the game between Arkansas and Houston will be all alone on top of the SWC chase.

Arkansas, which has never lost a game in Little Rock during Holtz' three-year tenure, stayed unbeaten in six games and that's what fifth-ranked Houston did as well in trouncing the injury-plagued and turnover-prone SMU Mustangs, 27-10. SMU fumbled the ball away five times in the first 20 minutes of the game.

The only other clubs left with just one league loss are Texas and the somewhat surprising Baylor Bears, who ran their season record to 5-2 Saturday with a 55-0 drubbing of Army. Baylor set a school record with 612 yards total offense and it was the Bears' largest point production in 50 years.

Otherwise Saturday, Texas Tech trashed Rice as expected, 30-7, on the 204-yard rushing day of James Hadnot; and TCU came back from an early 14-point deficit under the direction of freshman quarterback Kevin Haney to win its second game in a row, a 24-17 decision over Tulsa.

TCU has a chance to win three games in a row against Baylor in the next Saturday. In addition to the Arkansas-Houston biggie in

Fayetteville, Texas will try to rebound against SMU in Texas Stadium and Texas A&M (which took last week off) will be at Rice. Texas had been second only to No. 1 Alabama in total defense coming into the Arkansas game, but the Razorbacks put together two long drives against the Horns — including a crucial six-minute march early in the fourth quarter that led to what were eventually the winning points, a 31-yard field goal by Ish Ordonez.

But Texas still had a shot to tie the game in the late going when Goodson, who had kicked 11 field goals in the last three games, lined up for a 51-yard shot into a 20-mile-per-hour wind with less than two minutes to play. The kick fell short and to the left. Earlier in the game Goodson had missed a 41-yarder with the wind that sailed just outside the right upright.

"I had a job to do," said Goodson, "and I didn't do it."
