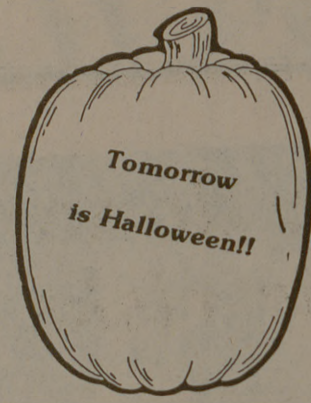

'Clean-cut kids' accused of possible arson charges

Upset of the perennial state football game, a fire department was called to a high school football game which turned into a \$300,000 inferno, spent the weekend at home with their parents wondering how they'll explain themselves to prosecutors ready to file felony arson charges.

The four, two current students at Richardson High School and two who graduated last spring, were picked up during the weekend on suspicion of burning the artificial turf at the Plano High School football field two weeks ago.

"It was just a prank that got out of hand," said Bill Threet, fire marshal in the Dallas suburb. "That pretty well describes it."

"They're four clean-cut kids. Average boys from good families. They all have good backgrounds. We're talking about arson charges. Felonies. They'll talk to the district attorney (Monday)."

On Oct. 13 underdog Richardson High School took on highly ranked Plano High in an emotionally charged game at Plano's field. Richardson came away with a 3-0

A few hours later, however, a fire department was called to a high school football game which turned into a \$300,000 inferno, spent the weekend at home with their parents wondering how they'll explain themselves to prosecutors ready to file felony arson charges.

An investigation showed the fire started when a student attempted to burn the "RHS" onto the field and, in the process, the student lit gasoline on the turf in the field.

When the gasoline was lit, the flames exploded and an amorphous blaze that destroyed a third of the field. Investigators speculated that the gasoline was lit with such intensity that when it was lucky to escape. Gasoline was abandoned at the scene and fingerprints that eventually led investigators to the four who were arrested.

Suppliers of the artificial turf estimated the damage at \$300,000 and said the entire field would have to be replaced.

Plano High School, which has a home game remaining on its schedule, has accepted an offer from Texas Stadium, home of the Cowboys, to play its game at

TO BE ELIGIBLE TO ORDER THE TEXAS A&M SENIOR RING, AN UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT MUST HAVE AT LEAST NINETY-TWO (92) SEMESTER HOURS, WITH 30 HOURS AT A&M AND BE IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE UNIVERSITY. USING MID-SEMESTER GRADES TO FULFILL THE ABOVE REQUIREMENTS. PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS:
1. MID-SEMESTER ORDERS WILL BE TAKEN ONLY FROM OCT. 29TH UNTIL DEC. 7, 1979.
