Third party candidate announces

WASHINGTON — Former New Hampshire Gov. Meldrim Thomson, accusing both major political parties of failing America in its hour of need, announced Wednesday he will be the presidential candidate of the yet-to-be-formed Constitution Party.

Thomson, a three-term governor of New Hampshire long associated with the most conservative wing of the GOP, said millions of Americans

have "lost confidence in the ability of either of the two main political parties to resolve the awesome problems facing our nation."

He said no funds have yet been raised for his third-party campaign and organization of the new party is just beginning, but he intends to work to have it placed on the ballot in all 50 states.

Thomson also announced that his son, Peter, an Oxford, N.H., politician, will manage his campaign and

that Rufus Shackelford of Wauchula, Fla., a longtime political conservative who served until recently as chairman of the American Party, will head the Thomson for President Committee.

Thomson said he will stress national security, inflation, energy and moral issues in his campaign.

He called for a substantial boost in arms spending while at the same time favoring a cut in overall federal

spending as a means of fighting inflation.

"For our future safety in a world rapidly growing communistic," Thomson said, "we must immediately reject the proposed SALT II treaty, reinstitute a uniform and fair national draft, substantially increase our appropriations for national security, build the B-1 bomber, the cruise and MX missiles and the neutron bomb."




