Texas A&M University's Oil Spill Technology Program is looking back on its involvement with the spill last summer and ahead to the coming year when currents may once again bring pollution and economic loss to the Texas beaches.
Dr. Roy Hann and the program were called on last July by the port of Brownsville to set up a base of study and documentation of the effects of the oil from a blown-out Mexican well on the Texas coastline.
Hann said they accepted the invitation because the area was farthest south and therefore most likely to be hit first by the spill.
"There were some preliminary indications we might get involved in Mexico," he said, "but that didn't come about."
He said, "We went down a month before the oil came to carry out what we call the 'before' studies. That's a luxury we don't usually have before an oil spill."
The group measured currents, evaluated the environmental systems of the area and staked off certain spots for study and comparison after the oil hit the beach. These test areas were photographed with color video systems and special data-backed cameras which record the date and location on each frame for accurate documentation.
He said they also inventoried equipment available in the local area for dealing with the oil as it came ashore and evaluated the criteria for the selection of disposal sites.
Hann expressed concern for the lack of federal response to the situation. He said, "They didn't send their people out to the field to do the things we were doing."
The group headed back to Brownsville in early August as the oil began to come ashore, he said, they had to determine the specific properties of the oil to be able to recommend clean-up methods.
"The oil was too thick to be handled by conventional pumps. This particular oil was more like toothpaste than, say, gasoline," he said.
They also checked the effectiveness of the equipment being used off and on shore and in most cases found it to be lacking. Again, documentation was the order of the day.
Hann and his co-workers are working on their reports about the spill from this end now. "They are making recommendations to the state as to how they should be able to have more control over what happens on the next spill." "We feel there should be more involvement of the state agencies for better protection of our coastline," he said.
"Rightly or wrongly the role of dealing with oil spills tends to fall on the government and so what we're trying to do is to educate the people the government so they'll know what they have to do to set up a program to deal with oil spills," he said.

Hann explained the process of the oil washing on to the beach. "It comes floating in and the sand and gets heavier. The oil don't remove it from the beach, it just gets spit back up later, it would have a hole in it." Hann is concerned with the loss of manpower and money to do clean-up methods now over the spill with oil spills. He said, "The ploy of operators using the minor spills was ineffective. When you have got to hit it hard, you have got to hit it fast, or you recommend a public operation to get the job done." He is also concerned with the reaction or lack of reaction from the federal government.
"If I were the owner of the wreck, I had a wreck right off Rhonde Island, I'd say, 'I clean up?' When Mexico up here you didn't clean up just go clean it up right in the resort areas and everywhere else." How can we expect an individual to react differently than the federal government?
Hann doesn't think inside sensitive estuaries permanent damage. He said jetties kept most of the rather than the booms near the U.S. Coast Guard.
He is concerned about the living in the area just offshore. This will affect these animals but has had input into the cases between Texas government and SEA.
"There are international agreements with laws that cooperation and compensation regard to spills from tankers, upon request, supply information that we had laws to Mr. White (the state general) and to the Environmental Affairs Commission that's looking into the spill."
He said he would not be surprised if somewhere along they were called on to provide further information.
Hann said the United States Mexico ought to have a joint agency plan for dealing with the Gulf of Mexico. The plan call for the payment of from those who have one problem to those that are by it and for the sharing of mental and technical information.

Hann and the Oil Spill Technology Assistance Program and the Environmental Engineering Division of the Civil Engineering Department of Texas A&M University through the Texas Engineering Experiment Station. They have been involved in other major projects around the world such as the Matula in the Straits of Mexico. This spill is now considered one of the largest in the world and has also been selected by the United Nations to international oil spill training in Africa, Colombia and France.
