

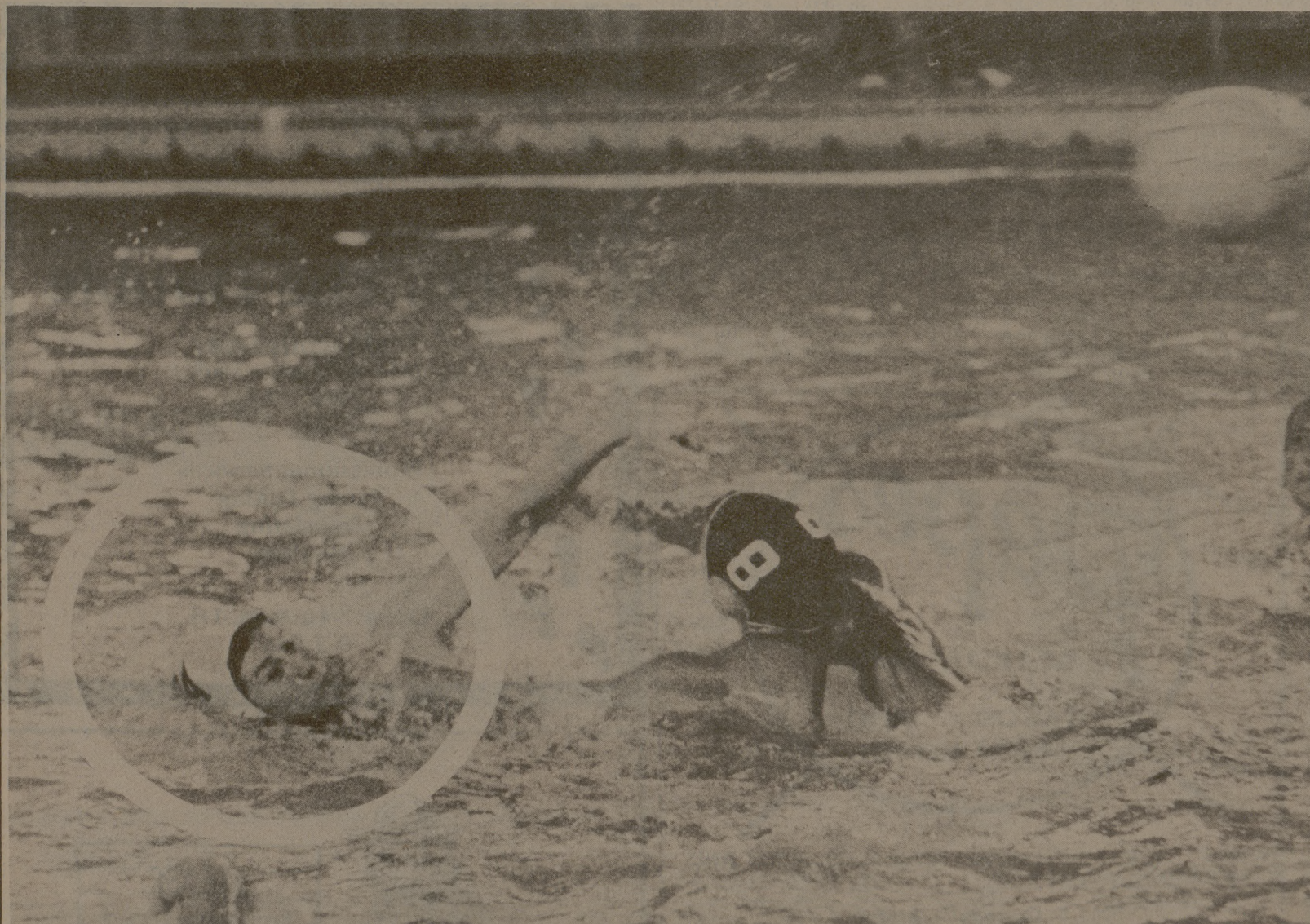

The "I Spy" photographer this week selects Jenny Johnson to be eligible for a Be Our Guest card for free food from McDon-

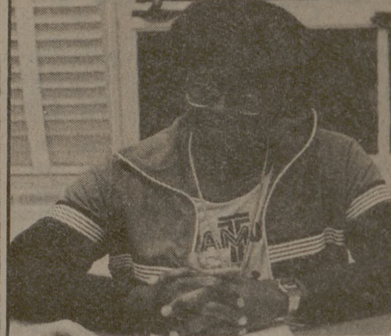
