TO BE ELIGIBLE TO ORDER THE TEXAS A&M SENIOR RING, AN UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT MUST HAVE AT LEAST NINETY-TWO (92) SEMESTER HOURS, WITH 30 HOURS AT A&M AND BE IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE UNIVERSITY. USING MID-SEMESTER GRADES TO FULFILL THE ABOVE REQUIREMENTS, PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS:
1. MID-SEMESTER ORDERS WILL BE TAKEN ONLY FROM OCT. 29TH UNTIL DEC. 7, 1979.
2. LEAVE YOUR NAME, MAJOR AND I.D. NUMBER WITH THE RING CLERK, HEATON HALL, AT LEAST TWO WEEKS BEFORE YOU PLAN TO ORDER YOUR RING AND NOT LATER THAN NOVEMBER 30TH. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY TELEPHONE.

U.S. military training of Iranians to cease

SAN ANTONIO — The number of Iranian military men undergoing training at U.S. Air Force bases has declined from 938 at the time Ayatollah Khomeini seized power to 245, a spokesman for the Air Training Command said Tuesday.
Doug Moore, an information specialist at ATC headquarters at Randolph Air Force Base in San Antonio, said Iran announced on Jan. 19, 1979, that it would not be sending any more trainees to the United States. He said the last Iranian is scheduled to graduate from undergraduate pilot training on Oct. 1, 1980.
Until the shah was deposed, most

of the Iranians learned English at the Defense Language School at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, but spokesman Joe McNally said no new trainees had arrived since January.
Moore said the Air Force began training Iranians, through a contract with the U.S. government, in 1950 and since that time approximately 9,400 Iranians have been trained by the Air Force.
Of the 245 Iranians still attending flying, navigation and technical schools in the United States, most are stationed at Air Force bases in Texas and Mississippi.
Moore presented a list of training bases and numbers of Iranians sta-

tioned there: Columbus AFB, Miss., 83 in pilot training; Laughlin AFB, 72 in undergraduate training; Sheppard AFB, 48 in undergraduate training; Reese AFB, 1 in navigator training; Mather AFB, Sacramento, Calif., 24, in navigator training; AFB, Denver, Colo., 1 in technical training; Keesler AFB, Biloxi, Miss., 1 in technical training; Kelly AFB, San Antonio, 1 in technical training.
Moore said the training was paid for by the Iranian government.

FAA accuses Braniff exhaustion of using unsafe planes

FORT WORTH — The Federal Aviation Administration announced Tuesday it had found a series of safety violations in a review of Braniff airline's aircraft maintenance and had recommended fines of \$1.5 million.
The company denied the allegations and indicated it would examine the FAA complaints before deciding what action to take.
FAA Southwest Regional Director C.R. Melugin Jr., said the alleged violations involved flights of a Boeing 747 and 727 and a Douglas DC-8. The complaints said the planes were not airworthy according to FAA regulations and that Braniff did not take the aircraft out of service.


Joe Kovarik, the southwest regional council for the FAA, said the violations occurred between August 1978 and October 1979. None of the alleged deficiencies resulted in deaths or injuries to passengers or crew members.
"Numerous flights were performed by aircraft not repaired or inadequately repaired after they sustained such damage as from blown tires and taxiing into a fuel truck," the FAA said in a statement.
"More than 30 flights were conducted over water when emergency life rafts had not received required inspections. Flights also were conducted in the 747 when various seats

were reclined so as to interfere or prevent the full opening of emergency doors. Several flights were conducted in a 727 when the main cabin door would not open and close properly.
"When this condition became known, the aircraft was ordered (by the FAA) grounded until it was determined to be in an airworthy condition."
"In addition, the airline operated a DC-8 on 447 flights over an 11-month period in an unairworthy condition — improper repairs on a crack in an engine pylon. Braniff continued to operate that aircraft after they agreed with FAA's determination that the repairs did not meet FAA approval."
The FAA said the violations reflected "a basic pattern of disregard" of FAA regulations on the part of Braniff management.
The FAA began reviewing commercial airline maintenance records after a Pacific Southwest airliner collided with a light plane last year over San Diego, Calif., killing 143 people. The FAA also initiated a review of maintenance records of American Airlines after its DC-10 crashed on takeoff at Chicago, killing 273 on May 25.
The complaints filed against Braniff were the first to be lodged as a preventative measure. Other airlines also are under review.
Braniff officials released a state-
