Kimball director dies, Winslow Texas art career ends

FORT WORTH — Dr. Richard Brown was ruthless in his pursuit of art and his belief that every piece of it had a life of its own and a special relationship to its owner.

Brown, who founded the Kimball Museum in Fort Worth and made it one of the finest in the world, died Tuesday of a heart attack at the age of 63.

The former director of the Los Angeles County Museum of Art had suffered from cancer for more than a year but a spokeswoman for the museum said the disease was not related to the heart failure, which occurred Monday at his home.

"About 10:30 (Monday night) he had what they thought was a mild heart attack," said Shirley Speieckerman, public relations director for the Kimball.

"At the hospital he had a major heart attack and then he died early (Tuesday morning)."

"He worked a full day yesterday (Monday). I talked to him and he was in very good spirits. He had just returned from New York and, like always, was talking about acquisitions."

Brown came to Fort Worth from Los Angeles in 1966 and began working on the museum that would open in 1972 as the Kimball — named for the late millionaire Fort Worth industrialist Kay Kimball.

Since its opening, Brown had guided Kimball on a course of acquisitions that made it one of the best art museums in the world.

"All's fair in love, war and art acquisition," Brown was fond of saying.

Among the most recent acquisitions were a late-

career Rembrandt titled "Portrait of a Young Man" and an El Greco titled "Giacomo Bosio."

"Every case, every object — whether it's a painting, sculpture whatever it is — is an individual, and somewhat different," Brown once said. "It's part of one's life. That's what makes it desirable. Its history and makes it unique, its relationship to its owner."

"I don't pretend to have the infallibility of Apollo of the arts and expert knowledge of the field," he once said. However, Brown did acknowledge he was an expert in some fields and that led him on his never ending pursuit of art for museum.

Designed by the late famed architect Louis Kahn at Brown's urging, Kimball covers everything prehistoric to 20th century art.

Highly regarded exhibits touring the nation recently were displayed at the Kimball as they stop in the Southwest. Recently an entire room of museum was given over to an African art collection secured by Brown.

The Kimball did not open Tuesday but Speieckerman said it would be open the remainder of the week. A memorial service was set at the museum Friday at 4 p.m. and a private cremation ceremony was planned.

Brown, chief curator and director of the Los Angeles county Museum of Art from 1960 to 1966, survived by his wife.

Kimball art curator David Robb was named as director until Brown's replacement could be named.

Campaign debt is reduced

Clements gets \$300,000

DALLAS — More than 700 persons paid \$500 each to attend a fund raising dinner for Gov. Bill Clements Wednesday, trimming the governor's debt remaining from his 1978 race for governor by about \$300,000.

Clements, who waged the most expensive campaign in Texas history to win the GOP nomination and then defeat Democrat John Hill in the general election, showed a campaign debt of \$4.75 million as of Jan. 17.

Other fundraisers in the past 10 months have reduced that debt to \$2.5 million, and Wednesday's black-tie dinner at the Apparel Mart was a joint celebration of the first anniversary of Clements' victory over Hill and a fundraiser to further cut the debt.

The program for the affair was informal, with only a few minutes

allotted for Clements to reminisce about his 1978 campaign, his victory that made him the first Republican governor in more than a century, and his first year in office.

"It was designed to be a fun party," said Herb Butram of Dallas, a member of the committee which arranged the dinner.

James Francis Jr., Clements' finance chairman, said the group is ahead of schedule on its attempt to pay off Clements' debt.

"We've got a long road to travel, but we have made good progress and

we're on our time line," Francis said. Clements' supporters hope to have the entire debt paid off by election day, although Clements has a term and will not face a reelection campaign until 1982.

Dinner spokesman Gary Galt said the dinner would gross \$350,000. "The net proceeds against the \$2.5 million debt, not sure what the net will be, but what that will reduce the debt," he said.
