MSC MBA/Law Day is an MSC council project designed to inform the student community about possible careers associated with Graduate Degrees in Law and Business Administration. The program is divided into two distinct presentations: the morning session concentrating on law opportunities, and the afternoon presentation concentrating on careers in business administration.

The Program consists of group discussions between students and recent A&M Former Students who have obtained Graduate Business and Law degrees from various schools across the nation. (This year's program includes graduates from schools such as Harvard, Northwestern, Texas, Rice, and Texas A&M.) During these sessions, panel members discuss their present job responsibilities, and other relevant information with people interested in obtaining an MBA or Law degree. The informal atmosphere of these discussions encourages active interaction between the panelists and members of the group.

Also present in the groups are faculty and admissions office representatives from major graduate business and law schools of this region, and the nation. These representatives participate in the group discussions, as well as distribute information and answer questions concerning an individual school's program. La principal distribute information, catalogues, and application forms form leading law and the size of the school sc ing law and business schools nationwide are also available at MBA/Law Day. Separating the morning Law and afternoon MBA presentations is an informal barbeque lunch held in the MSC. This meal provides an excellent opportunity for students to sit down and exchange ideas with an individual alumnus or graduate school representative on a one-to-one basis. For students who have decided upon graduate school, or even those who are undecided, MSC MBA/Law Day is a chance to learn, explore, and ask questions about careers in Business Administration and Law. 
