Doctors dispute youth death ruling

SAN ANTONIO — A panel of three medical specialists, headed by Dr. Howard Huntington of the local University of Texas Medical School, are disputing the Bexar County Medical Examiner's ruling of death by natural causes in the case of Billy Barnett, 15.

Barnett died on Oct. 22 while witnesses said he was being kicked by a group of six classmates from Holmes High School who followed him from a school bus. Dr. Ruben Santos, the medical examiner, ruled that Barnett died of a congenital aneurysm, a weak blood vessel in his brain which just happened to burst at the time Barnett was being kicked.

But Huntington, a neurologist, testified in a hearing that Santos' slides showed no evidence of aneurysm or ruptured blood vessel. The three doctors said it appeared the artery which Santos reported bursting, actually was severed during the autopsy.

However, Santos stuck to his ruling after hearing the different point. He said that care was taken removing the brain so that it was not damaged.

Reyes and five juveniles charged with murder, despite Santos' ruling, and are scheduled for trial next month.

Rice sold to Iran now going to Iraq

FREEPORT — The Swiss owner of a shipment of rice, destined for Iran but sitting on a Texas dock because longshoremen refuse to load it, has resolved the cargo to Iraq so that it can be moved, possibly by Friday, a shipping company owner said.

Robert Ford Sr., owner and president of Ford Shipping in Galveston, identified the shipment's owner as Tradax of Geneva, an international grain trading firm.

"They were in the process of re-

selling the rice when the longshoremen stopped the loading of the Serenity at Freeport, said Ford, who is in charge of clearing the cargo through customs.

He said the rice will be shipped to Basra, Iraq.

"I am waiting for official documentation of the sale to Iraq so that it can be cleared," he said. "I don't want them to think we're doing anything over their heads. We show them the rice is bound for Iraq and not Iran."

Therapy defense used in misconduct trial

LUBBOCK — Lawyers for a juvenile probation officer accused of soliciting a 15-year-old probationer as a prostitute and with trying to engage her in nude modeling and photography said the efforts were part of shock treatment counseling.

Roy King, 25, is charged with four misdemeanor counts of official misconduct.

Authorities allege King solicited the probationer's services as a prostitute, with a portion of her earnings to be returned to him. King also is accused of taking the girl to a "known house of prostitution."

Attorneys Chuck Lanchar and Byron Chappell, however, have told the court their client was simply employing the kind of shock treatment depicted in the documentary film, "Scared Straight."

The defense called District Attorney John T. Montford Wednesday, as well as Paulina Jacobo, the district attorney's juvenile division chief.

Jacobo testified shock treatment can be effective with certain personality types, but warned such remedies must be demonstrated under restricted conditions and with prop-

er screening of the youths involved. Montford disagreed with the defense that King had made the decisions in attempting shock treatment with the girl.

"I'd call it a terrible piece of call," he said.

Lloyd Watts, King's superior, also testified Wednesday that he would "absolutely not" recommend shock therapy in counseling juvenile probationers.

Garwood named Texas highest court justice

AUSTIN — Will Garwood, the son of a former Texas Supreme Court justice, was sworn in today as the newest member of the court, and Chief Justice Greenhill praised Gov. Bill Clements' decision to appoint a "man" to the nine-member court.

Garwood, son of former Justice W. St. John Garwood, is the Republican on the court.

He replaces Sam Johnson, who resigned to accept appointment to the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals.

"One of the nicest things about your appointment is the fact that what I would call a younger man, the court," Greenhill told Garwood at the conclusion of the swearing-in ceremony.

Garwood will serve until the general election, then must be elected to the high court.

"To serve on a supreme court is one of the states is a cherished honor of any lawyer. It is especially so in this state with its tradition of independence and integrity," Garwood said.

Clements presented Garwood to the court, and said the new justice had been recommended by attorneys from throughout the state.

"He is an attorney with a great background in record, a fine education at the University of Texas, and following in the footsteps of his illustrious father," the governor said.

W. St. John Garwood served the court during the 1950s.

Garwood is now partner in the Austin law firm of Graves, Dougherty Hearon, Moody and Garwood.


