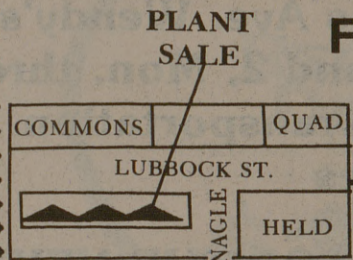

Ex-Tech boss geological institute chief

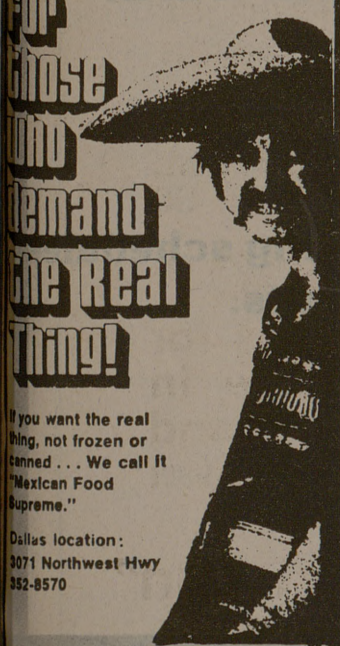
