A&M grad to get geoscience award

Famed Houston petroleum engineer and geologist Michel T. Halbouty will receive the second Geosciences and Earth Resources Medal for Distinguished Achievement during ceremonies at Texas A&M University Dec. 14.

Halbouty, a 1930 graduate of Texas A&M who has earned Distinguished Alumnus status, will receive the medal during commencement.

Two years ago, one of the geosciences facilities on the Texas A&M campus was renamed the Michel T. Halbouty Geosciences Building in honor of the internationally recognized expert who warned two decades ago of today's energy crisis.

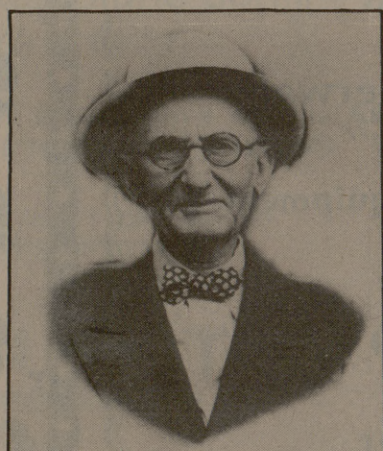
