mercial sense He proposed to conduct a further study of sail power for the Maritime Administration. The government liked the idea but decided to put a

stages of selecting a winner from several bidders, including Bergeson.

Bergeson and fellow sailing enthusiasts, meanwhile, have formed the Windship Development Corp., which plans to develop sail-powered

commercial vessels on its own. 'We've been talking to a lot of shipping people," Bergeson said in a telephone interview. "Nobody is laughing at this. They can't afford not to consider it.

If sailing ships do make a commercial comeback, they may not resemble their predecessors. The government wants both square and foreand-aft sail rigs considered in the study as well as rigid airfoils and windmills.

All agree such ships probably would have auxiliary engines, just as many pleasure sailboats do. The government thinks they might be good for bulk cargoes. Bergeson says they also could carry general cargo and passengers.




