Fuel of future coming from boiling, burning woodchips

Pushed by steadily rising oil costs, the use of wood for fuel is beginning to expand in Houston. A team of Texas A&M University researchers has shown the Southwest's largest utility line clearance company how it could convert cuttings from power line clearance and maintenance to fuel.
Trees Inc., currently under contract to Houston Lighting and Power, collects 113 tons of wood residues daily. Company executives had three choices: continue to landfill, explore use of the residue in other products or chip all the wood down for use as fuel.
"They used to take the scrap, load it on a truck and haul it all to the landfill," said Dr. Wayne Murphey, head of the Texas A&M's Department of Forest Science. "Now, they're using it for fuel."
By chipping the wood residues

down to matchstick size and burning them in a boiler, this one small operation produces energy equivalent to that of about 110 barrels of oil a day. In a year that would be 30,500 barrels of oil, over a 250 day working calendar.
"The bottom line is energy," stressed Dr. Joseph Massey, co-author of the wood chip energy study.
"Wood chipping is a viable energy alternative in this case, but in all such operations one must look at the dollar or economic aspect as well as the energy aspect. We don't want to expand more energy than we develop," he added.
The cost of the landfill totaled \$12,457 daily, the fuel chip operation \$12,448.
Cost-efficient wood burning plants are feasible using current technology, said Murphey. About 10 dry tons of wood per acre would have to come from "energy plantations" to meet the minimal needs of a utility generating operation. "But, it can be

done," he said.
Jasper in the southeastern part of the state, is considering the ground on what would be the Texas plant to produce part of the total energy utility needs of the wood-burning plant.
The Houston and Jasper plants are not unique. More than 150 England companies now use wood chips as fuel. Last summer the Department of Energy set a goal of the use of wood for fuel in the next years.
The majority of research and development has been supported by private interest, Murphey said. "Federal input into biomass research has been minimal. The potential and productivity of the plants are not being realized."
Wood programs account for \$11 million of the Department of Energy's total budget of \$1 billion. However, outlays for research are expected to almost double next year.
