Former shah of Iran st sa thas gallstone removed tortei

United Press International NEW YORK— The deposed shah of Iran has undergone a non-surgical procedure that "crushed and removed fragments" of a gallstone in his bile duct and was listed in guarded condition Tuesday, a spokesman for New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center said.

The spokesman said studies would be conducted "for the next few days" to determine if any of the fragments were left in the bile duct or if inflammation develops.

The procedure, which involved dropping a "bas-ket-like device" through a tube inserted in the shah's body, occurred at 10:30 p.m. Monday.

Sources at the hospital said it was doubtful Shah Mohammad Reza Pahlavi would be able to leave the hospital Tuesday or Wednesday. They were unable to estimate when his medical condition would allow him to leave the United States.

One source said it was his "understanding that the physicians, if they follow the medical program previously outlined, would want to begin chemotherapy treatments" at the hospital. That, he said, could prolong the shah's hospitaliza-

tion indefinitely.

Ray Rebhann, the hospital spokesman, said the gallstone — detected after the shah's gallbladder was removed Oct. 24 — "was located where expected and crushed, permitting the extraction of several fragments.'


The non-surgical procedure was conducted by Dr. Joachim Burhenne, chief of the department of radiol-ogy at the University of British Columbia, assisted by staff members of New York Hospital.

Burhenne, who has successfully completed 800 such operations, refused to discuss the shah's case directly

The shah has completed a series of 10 radiation treatments to diminish the size of several malignant tumors in his neck. Rebhann said "the expected side effects" from the radiation - inflammation of the esophagus and pharynx and a high fever --- "have

been brought under control." The hospital source said the reason doctors listed the shah's condition as guarded "was to hedge their bets — to see if there are any side effects from the crushing of the stone.

The source said the shah's physicians said they would prefer to begin chemotherapy treatments at the hospital, although the procedure is available elsewhere, including Mexico.
