offensive player of the year in the SWC, Baylor linebacker Mike Singletary was chosen defensive player of

the year and TCU linebacker Darrell Patterson led in the balloting for freshman of the year. The UPI all-conference team was

chosen by a panel of writers and broadcasters who covered SWC games this year. Longhorns Johnnie Johnson, Der-

rick Hatchett and Ricky Churchman members of what Texas' assistant athletic director Bill Ellington called the best secondary he has ever seen in college football — were all named to the all-conference squad. Texas has surrendered only 76.9




