French police Disc Pad Sets 9.95 and up doubt youth's **UFO** story

United Press International CERGY-PONTOISE, France A teen-ager who disappeared after a reported UFO sighting in the western Paris suburb of Cergy-Pontoise returned home Monday and told police he was unable to recall any-thing about his week-long absence.

Police said Franck Fontaine, 19, told them the last thing he remembered was seeing a glowing sphere about the size of a tennis ball by the hood of his car Nov. 26.

Authorities were openly skeptical about the possibility of a UFO kidnapping and scheduled a court appearance for Fontaine and two friends who reported his disappearance to further discuss the matter.


Officials, however, said Fontaine and his friends, Salomon N'Diaye and Jean-Pierre Prevot, have not varied from their originial state-
