

Temple walks onto title game

Temple High coach Bob Queen has heard plenty about his players in the college and professional ranks, but he says no one could be happier than he is over one walk-

Kevin Korompai played soccer during the early year, but six games into the season he walked into Queen's office and volunteered to do the kicking chores for the Wild-

"We'd been having trouble kicking extra points and field goals, and we see every Sunday what soccer players are doing in the pros," Queen said. "So I told him to get on out and we'd give him a

Korompai has been doing the best kicking ever since, and no one was any happier about it last year than McQueen.

With 31 seconds left in the first half, Korompai booted a 27-yard field goal which provided the only points in Temple's 3-0 victory over

It was a Texas high school record. The game was the first of the U.S. semifinals and the championship game against Houston Memorial. That game will be played

McKinney defeated Bay City, 20-13, in the Class AAA championship in the Astrodome, and Wheeler

led High Island, 33-21, for the Class B state title. In the other Class AAA semifinal, Memorial defeated

In Class AA, Van defeated Childress, 13-9, and McGregor beat Edna, 14-7. Van and McGregor will meet at 8 p.m. Friday in Mesquite for the state championship.

And, in Class A, defending champion China Spring defeated Seagraves, 16-9, and Hull-Daisetta beat Troup, 22-21. China Spring and Hull-Daisetta will play for the state crown at 8 p.m. Friday in Bryan.

Lewisville led in penetrations, 3-1, and missed a 37-yard field goal late in the fourth quarter which would have tied the game. Also, on their first offensive drive the Farmers moved to the Temple seven before a fumble was recovered by the Wild-

McKinney used two first-half punt returns, one for 57 yards and the second for 75, and a pair of field goals as well as two extra points by Darrell Smith, to outclass Bay City for the state championship. The Black Cats scored with 24 seconds left in the game on a 44-yard pass from Harold Smith to Larry Brown.

Benny Baker ran for two Wheeler touchdowns and quarterback Rick Brown threw for two others as the Mustangs won their 45th game in 46 outings — their only loss in the past three and a half seasons coming against Union Hill in the 1978 state championship game.

Baker scored on runs of six and two yards and caught a 28-yard scoring pass from Brown. Brown also hit Mike Gallagher on a 27-yard touchdown pass and Willie Valencia scored on a 20-yard run. Mike Vans

kicked one extra point and Brown threw to Russell Gaines for two more points.

High Island scored on a four-yard run by Butch Peters, a 28-yard pass from John Valastro to Kendall Barrow and an eight-yard pass from Valastro to Mike Rollins. Peters kicked all three extra points.

Memorial used a three-yard run by Paul Morales and a 67-yard pass from wingback Todd Kissner to Ben Heinrich on its first two possessions to defeat Alice. The Mustangs moved 73 yards on 13 plays after receiving the second-half kickoff for their other touchdown, a one-yard drive by Mar Schroder. Tom Murphy added a 36-yard field goal and one extra point to complete the Memorial scoring.

Alice, which finished with a 12-2 record, scored with 69 seconds left in the game on a two-yard blast by fullback Ernie Balboa. Quarterback Chris Soza then ran in the double extra points.

Erick Gee recovered a loose football in the end zone following a bobbed punt at the 10-yardline to provide the winning margin for McGregor's Bulldogs over Edna.

The other Bulldog touchdown came on a 78-yard drive climaxed by a 16-yard gallop by Donnis Dickson with 18 seconds left in the first quarter. Kenneth Patterson kicked both McGregor extra points. Edna scored on a 59-yard drive, with the tally coming on a 59-yard pass from quarterback Rene Sanchez to halfback Darrell Harris. Will McNeill kicked the extra point.

Meanwhile, Van was defeating Childress in the other Class AA semifinal. Fullback Danny Brockway ran for two yards in the third quarter and for five yards in the fourth, and Terry Holland kicked the extra point. Childress scored on a 33-yard field goal and a one-yard run, both by Perry Morren.

Quarterback Mark Davis ran for touchdowns of 25 and four yards after he had been sacked in the end zone for a first-quarter safety to pace China Spring past Seagraves. Ken Elliot added a 38-yard field goal and an extra point to complete the China Spring scoring. Fullback Davis Morgan ran two yards for the Seagraves touchdown and then kicked the extra point to complete the scoring.

Quarterback John Wiggins threw three touchdown passes to George Westbrook for 14, 32 and 11 yards in the Hull-Daisetta victory. But it was the toe of Tim Abraham, who booted a 33-yard field goal and one extra point, which actually kicked the Bobcats into the championship game.

Troup scored on a one-yard run by Derrick Davis, a four-yard pass from Jerry Giles to Kent Lindsey and a three-yard run by Johnny Dowby. Giles then threw to Lindsey on double conversion points to pull Troup to within one point as time ran out.

The Gauchos led 32-31 at halftime and stayed in front by scoring 20 of 34 points in the second half on

The Gauchos, following Ocasio's touchdown, won the game at the foul line. Ocasio hit all 11 of his free throws of Monday and the California school converted game in the 40 attempts from the foul line. Aggies were only 15-26 on foul shots. Lady Woods had a game-high 24 points for Texas A&M, now 5-4, and Edna Wright added 15. But only six Aggies scored points in the game, compared to nine players for the 3-3
