right. But, if a tank car derails, over-turns and spills its contents, real danger exists. Explosions, fires, and poisonous fumes are among the possibilities

A 1977 study of railroad safety by the Texas Transportation Institute reported that, in 1974, 17 percent of the nation's chemical and allied products which were shipped by rail ori-ginated in Texas. Additionally, stateoriginated shipments of petroleum and coal products comprised 29 percent of the national total.

In the same year, Texas was fourth in the United States in number of derailments, the study said.

'The potential for catastrophic accidents from the movement of hazardous materials in Texas is among the highest in the nation, given the large amount of chemical and petrochemical shipments that originate in Texas," the report said.
