Most recently, its use in home hair dryers touched off a public health scare that resulted in the manufacturers' voluntary recall of many of the drvers.

Research linking asbestos with cancer and other noncurable illnesses began surfacing more than a de-cade ago. Because it often takes 25 to 30 years from the time of asbestos exposure until the disease symptoms occur, Selikoff said Americans are already facing a major public health

Aside from "meager attempt regulate new asbestos use and monitor occupational exposure, tually nothing is being done to a medy the public health failure a turn back the legacy of death fm asbestos," he said.

Selikoff said an epidemic of asb tos-related diseases is a publiched failure rather than a failure of the medical profession.

'We have made an uncons decision to accept some level of m tality as the price we must pay for

usefulness," he said. Selikoff said he does not beleve there is any "safe" level of exposuto asbestos and the only way to minate its diseases is to eliminat material.
