# Hot bottle New device shows promise for nuclear fusion

LOS ALAMOS, N.M. - Sciensts at the Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory are making final adjust-ments on a device they hope will ake them one step closer to deelopment of a virtually limitless

upply of energy. The device is a 7-foot wide, donut-shaped tube wrapped by 12 magnetic discs the size of truck tires and fed by a seemingly endless sup-ply of electric cables. It is called mply "ZT-40."

Technically, ZT-40 is a "torroidal magnetic bottle," a device which in larger form may be used to power nuclear fusion reactors.

Scientists throughout the world recurrently working on several difrent approaches to achieve conmlled fusion reactions.

Fusion reactions like those in the sun occur when two light elements wilide, fuse under intense pressure nd heat to form a heavier element, releasing energy in the process. In theory, that energy would be used o heat water and then power a eam turbine to produce electric-

Unlike the atom-splitting fission eaction used in today's nuclear ower plants, nuclear fusion is con-idered cleaner and less dangerous. Scientists see tremendous potenal in fusion reactors. The basic

gram is so enormous for civilization that we can't allow this possibility to go untried," said Dr. Harry Dreicer, head of the LASL Con-trolled Thermonuclear Research Division.

ZT-40 is just one step in many aimed at developing a workable fu-sion generating plant. But the steps remaining are difficult ones and best estimates are that the ultimate device won't be operating until the early part of the 21st century.

The key problem facing development is that fusion reactions only occur at extreme temperatures, up to 100 million degrees centigrade, making it impossible for the reaction to come in contact with any material known to man.


