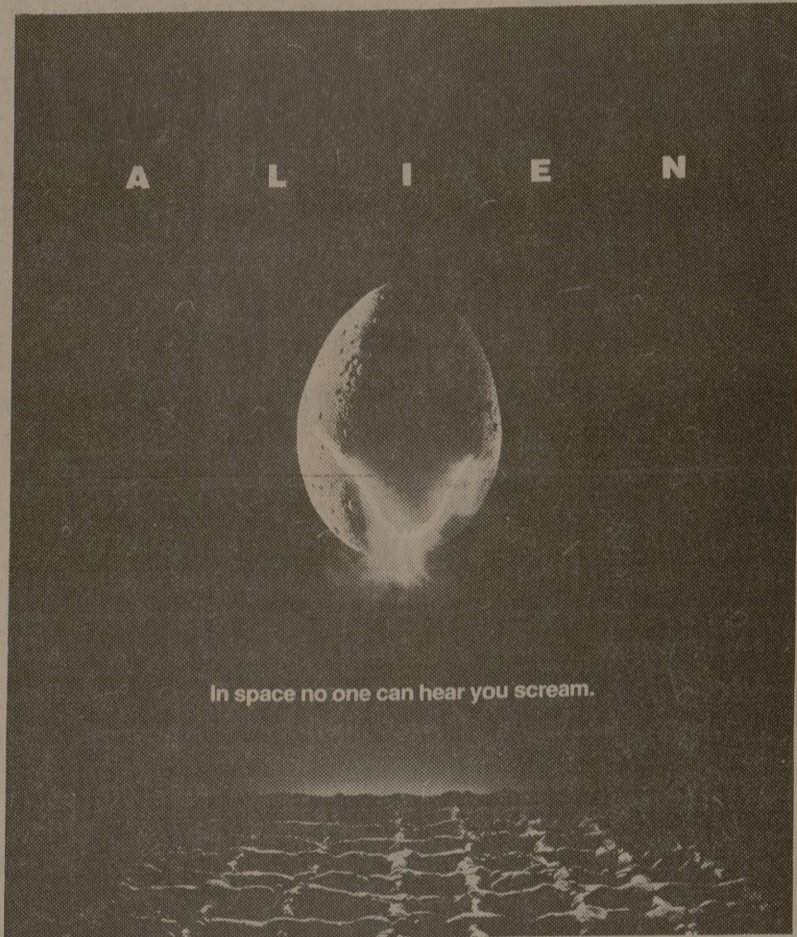

Bergland says takeover eases farm losses

WASHINGTON — Agriculture Secretary Bob Bergland said Wednesday the government takeover of private traders' contracts to sell grain and soybeans to Russia was necessary to protect farmers from a disastrous collapse of market prices.
Bergland disputed charges that the government moved to save grain traders but not farmers after President Carter embargoed 17 million tons of grain and 1 million tons of soybeans bound for Russia.
He said that to protect farmers of the country from a disastrous col-

lapse of market prices officials had to keep the grain dealers from losses that would reverberate down through the whole trading system, finally reaching the farmer.

Bergland, in a speech to the Pacific Northwest Farm Forum in Spokane, Wash., said if the contracts were not taken over "the banks that financed the grain companies would insist on the companies dumping the grain back into the marketplace, crushing prices and causing losses of millions of dollars."

He said our farmers will not "take a financial bath" because a series of government actions are intended to take enough grain off the market so the supply will be the same as be-

fore the embargo.
He said this is the first time an administration has taken action to ease farmers' burdens from the effects of American farm product exports.

Connally advocates Persian Gulf blockade

NASHUA, N.H. — The United States could blockade the Persian Gulf and Cuba if the Russians move over the Afghanistan border into Iran, Republican presidential candidate John Connally said Thursday.
"They're moving toward capturing the resources of the Middle East," the former Texas governor said of the Soviet presence in Afghanistan.

He told a group of southern New Hampshire businessmen and community leaders that the Russians consider Afghanistan "just a way station on the way to the Persian Gulf, the warm water port they've wanted since the days of Catherine the Great 300 years ago."

Connally said if he were president and the Russians made a move toward Iran, he would set up a selective blockade of "all of the shipments out of the Persian Gulf" except petroleum flowing to United States allies. However, he said he would not allow any Iranian oil to make it out of the Middle East.

Connally also advocated blockading Cuba if the Russians move into Iran. He said such a naval blockade of the island should continue until the Cuban government pulls its troops out of Angola, Ethiopia and South Yemen.

Stopping in the first state to hold a GOP presidential primary, Connally had particularly harsh words for President Carter — saying the nation's commander in chief has shown the Russians "weakness and appeasement."

"The most certain way to be involved in a war is to be weak," he said.

Later, at a brief questioning period with reporters, Connally said: "I think we should drop the Olympics for a year." He said he would seek to have the quadrennial games moved out of Moscow.

Connally was asked about the recent claim of one of his opponents of the upcoming New Hampshire primary — former CIA director George Bush.

In Nashua last week, Bush said he finished a strong second in the Iowa caucuses and in the New Hampshire primary behind former California Gov. Ronald Reagan. He said the other GOP candidates would begin dropping out of the race.

"I think it's wishful thinking," Connally said of Bush.

"He (Bush) should finish first in both," Connally said, referring to the amount of time Bush has spent campaigning in the two states.

In a campaign tour through Maine and New Hampshire Wednesday, Connally criticized the Carter administration for failing to develop a foreign policy that recognized the "actualities that exist in the world."

"Carter used the wrong strategy," he said. "The Soviets have positioned themselves to fight a war of resources and we have failed to even understand the nature of the battle."
