Soviets strip Nobel winner's titles

MOSCOW — Nobel Peace Prize-winning physicist Andrei Sakharov has been stripped of all his state titles and awards because of his "subversive activities," the newspaper Izvestia reported Tuesday. He also apparently was under arrest.

It was the harshest measure ever taken against the Russian physicist for his human rights activities. His reported arrest was impossible to confirm, since police officers barred reporters from approaching Sakharov's sixth-floor apartment.

The reported arrest and the stripping of his awards signals a major crackdown on dissident activity and a stepup in tension between the Soviet Union and the United States, which has repeatedly criticized the Kremlin on human rights issues.

The move against Sakharov, 58, came in apparent response to anti-Soviet measures by President Carter, who imposed a grain and high-technology embargo to protest Soviet intervention in Afghanistan. Carter also has threatened to call for a world boycott of the 1980 Moscow Olympics.

Izvestia said the government had warned Sakharov many times about his activities.

"Andrei Sakharov has been conducting subversive activities against the Soviet state for a number of years," Izvestia said.

"In this connection, he was repeatedly warned by representatives of appropriate state bodies, public organizations and prominent Soviet scientists about the impermissibility

of such activities.

"Ignoring these warnings, Sakharov lately embarked on the road of open calls to reactionary circles of imperialist states to interfere in the Soviet Union's internal affairs.

"Taking into consideration numerous proposals by the Soviet public, the presidium of the Supreme Soviet of the Soviet Union has deprived Andrei Sakharov of the title of Hero of Socialist Labor and all state awards, and the Council of Ministers of the Soviet Union has deprived him of the titles of laureate of the Soviet prizes that were awarded to him."

Those awards included the Order of Lenin and the Stalin prize, which has since been changed to the State Prize.



Britain possible alternative site for summer Olympics

LONDON — Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher Tuesday offered Britain as an alternative site for some of the events scheduled for the Moscow Olympics.

Thatcher told the House of Commons that she was writing to the British Olympic Association to urge the International Olympic Committee to switch the summer Olympics from Moscow.

"We have, in fact, offered to make available some of the sites in this

country that we have for some events," she said.

Government officials said an urgent study was being conducted of sites throughout the country that could be used for Olympic sports.

Among the sites being considered were three London stadiums, the Meadowbank stadium in Edinburgh, the International Rowing Basin at Holme Pierrepont, and the Isle of Wight's yachting facilities, government officials said.

President Carter Sunday urged

that the Olympics be switched to an alternative site or sites, but the International Olympic Committee made clear on many occasions that it was both legally and technically possible to move the Games.

"They will be held in Moscow nowhere," an IOC spokesman said. Government sources said Britain is willing to finance the alternative sites. However, it was not immediately evident whether the government realized the cost of such a project could easily exceed \$100 million.
